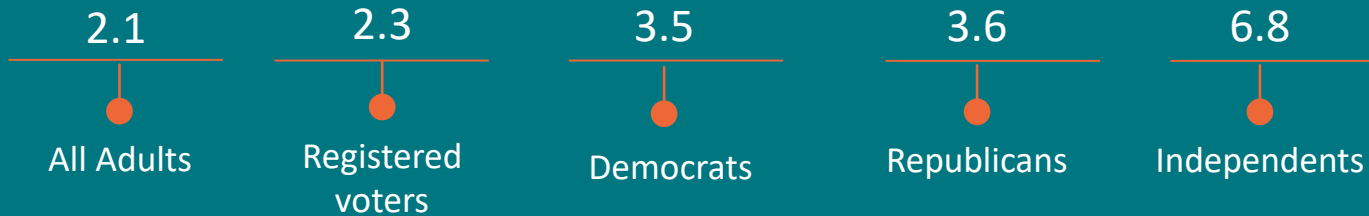

The precision of the Reuters/Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval.

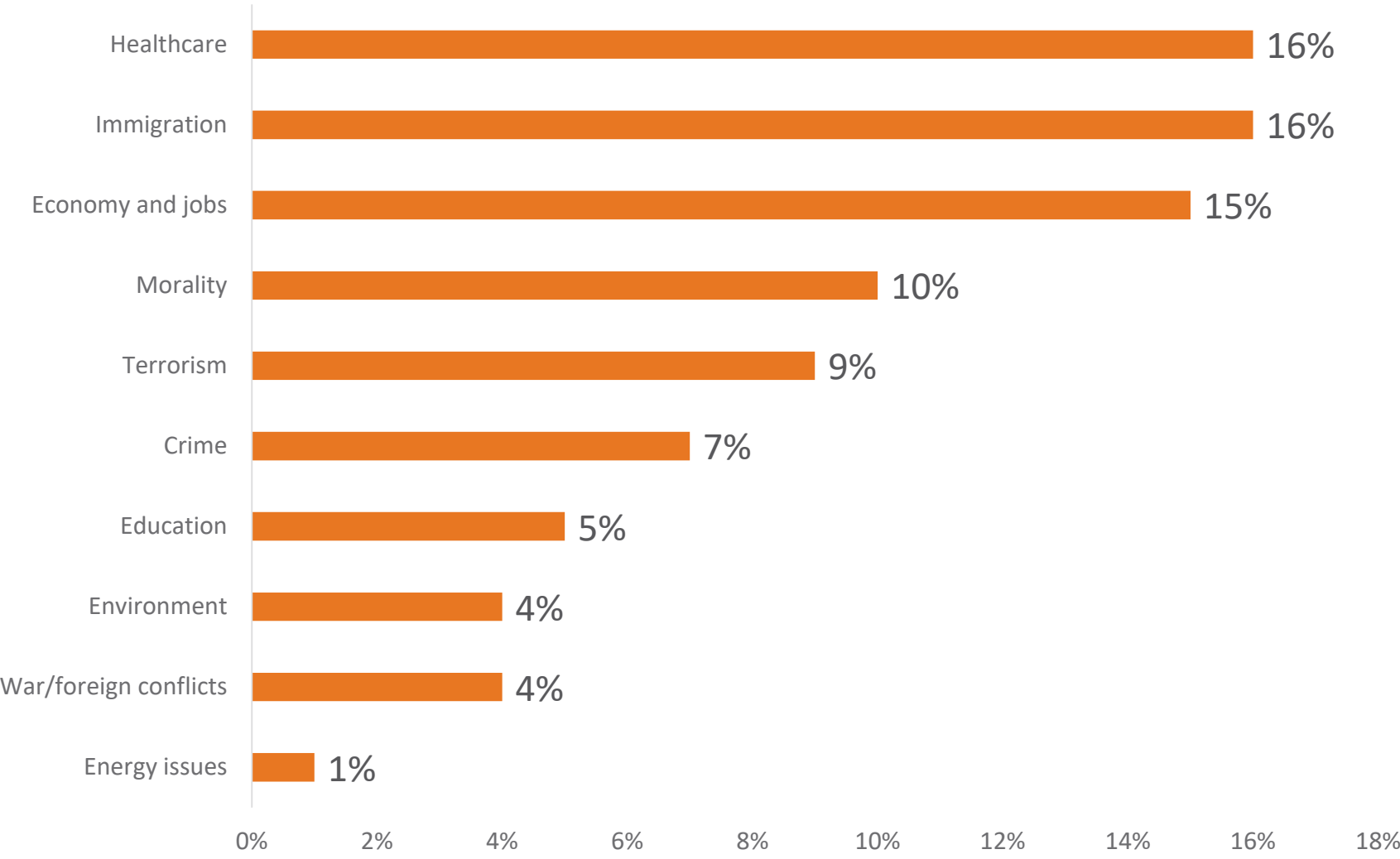

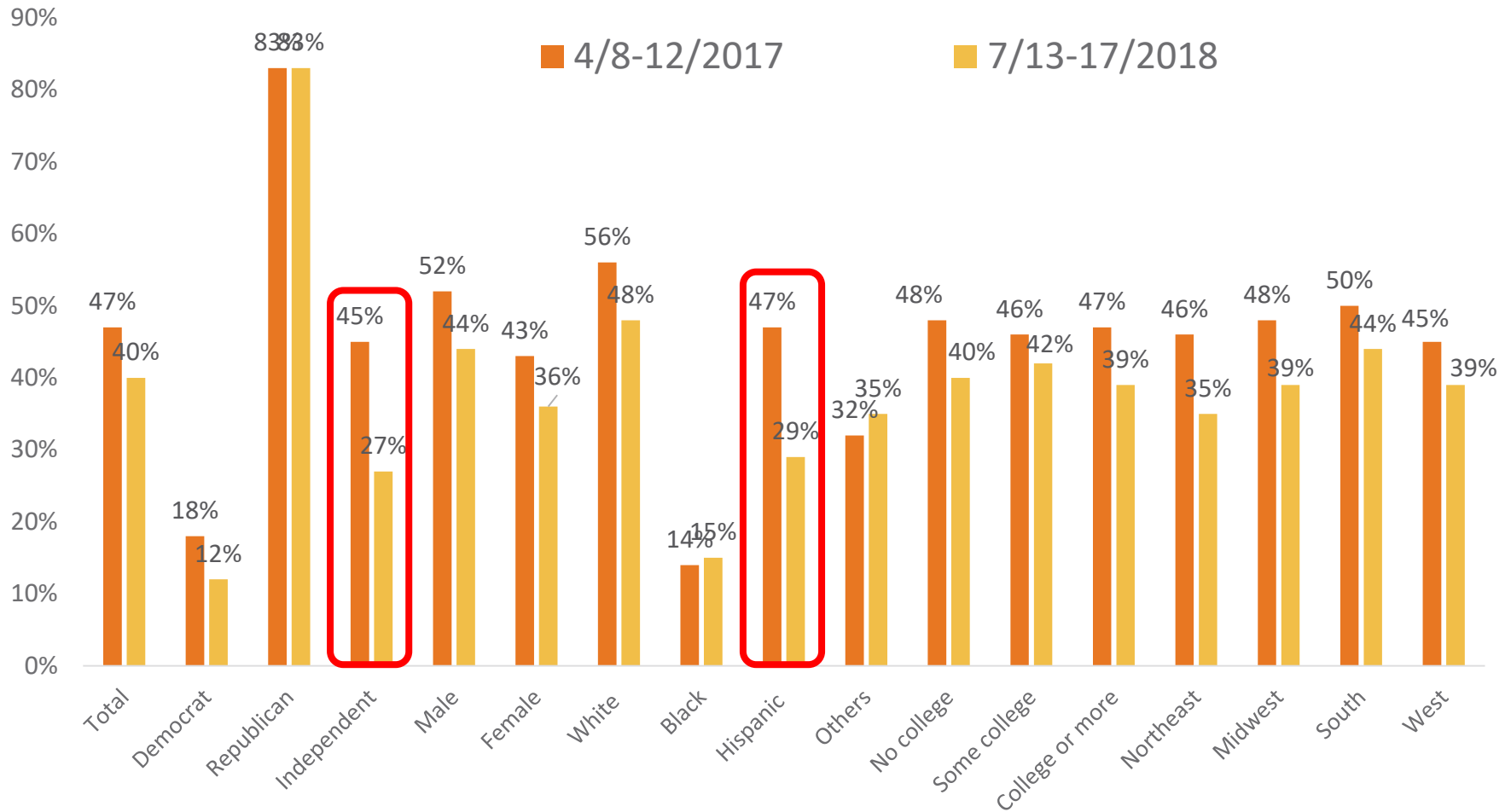
Main Problems

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?



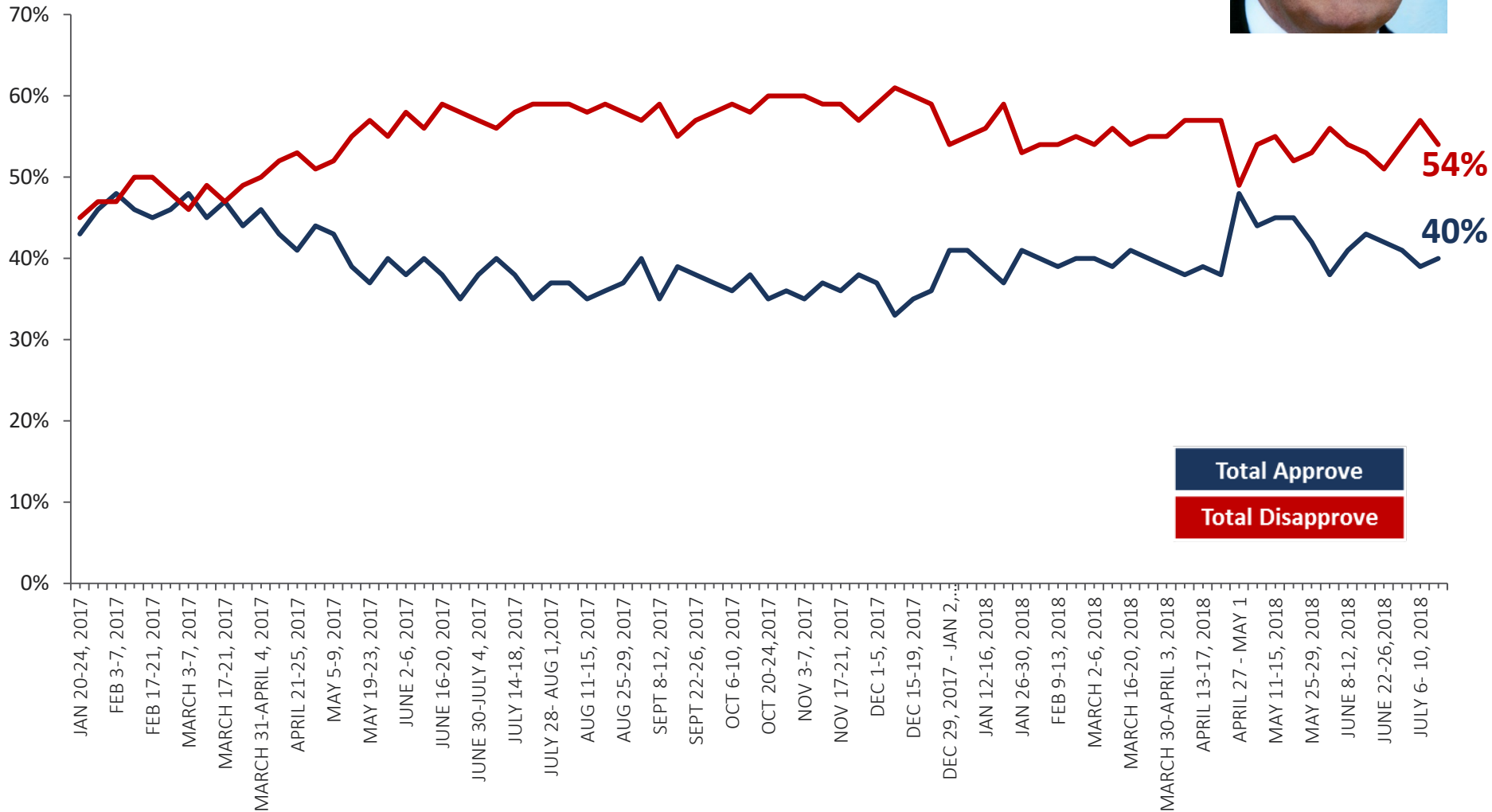

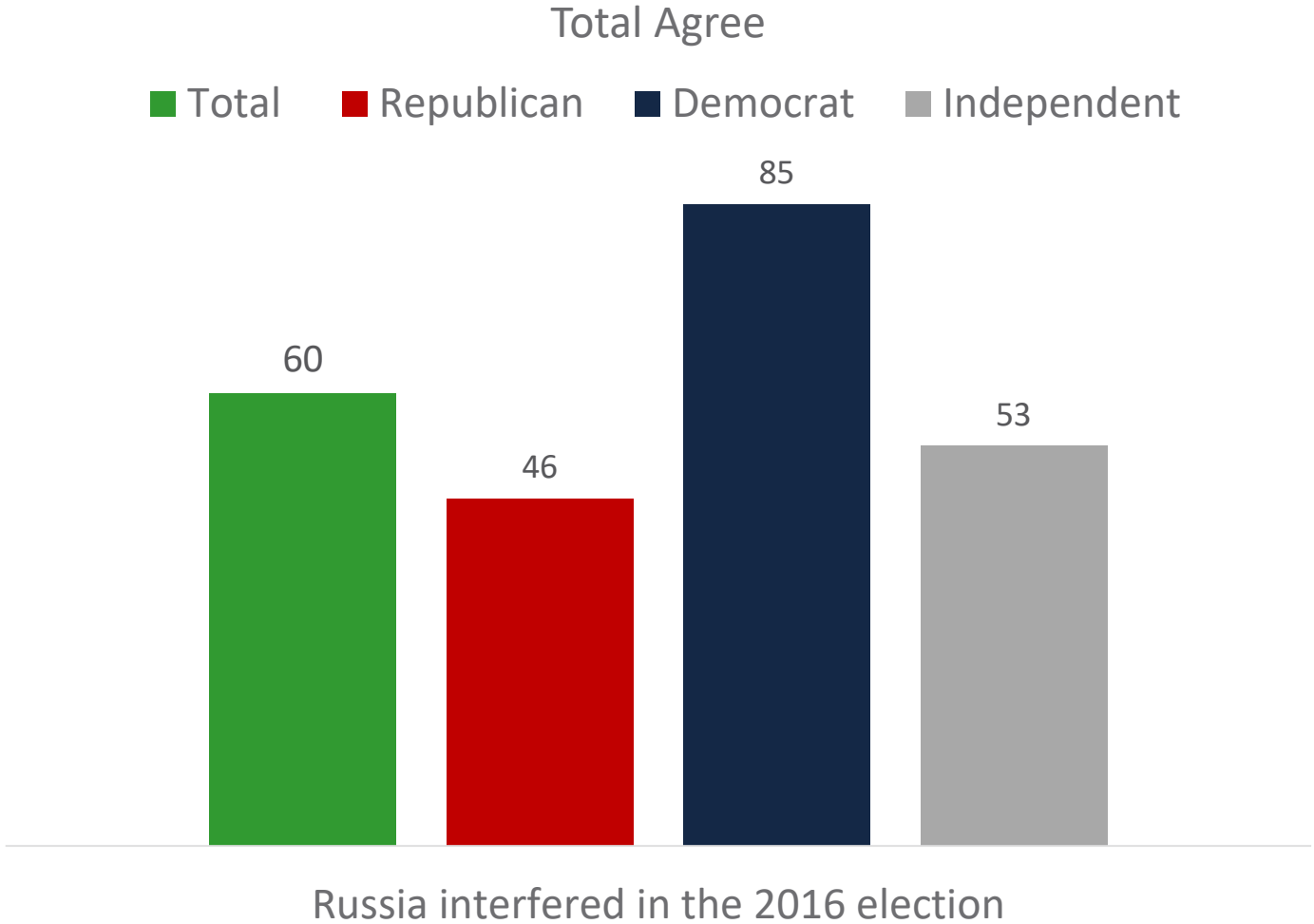

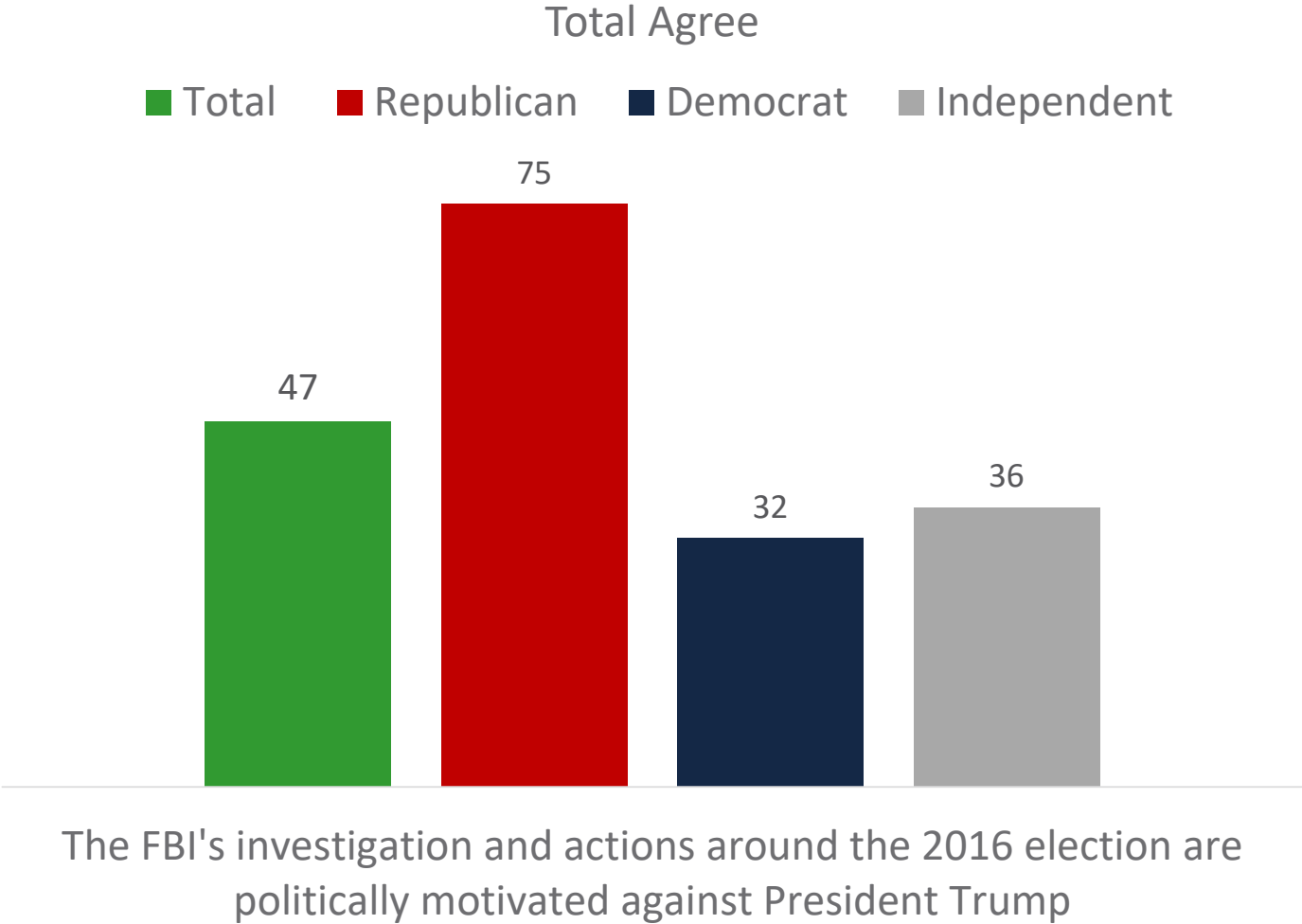
The majority of Americans believe Russia interfered in the 2016 election...

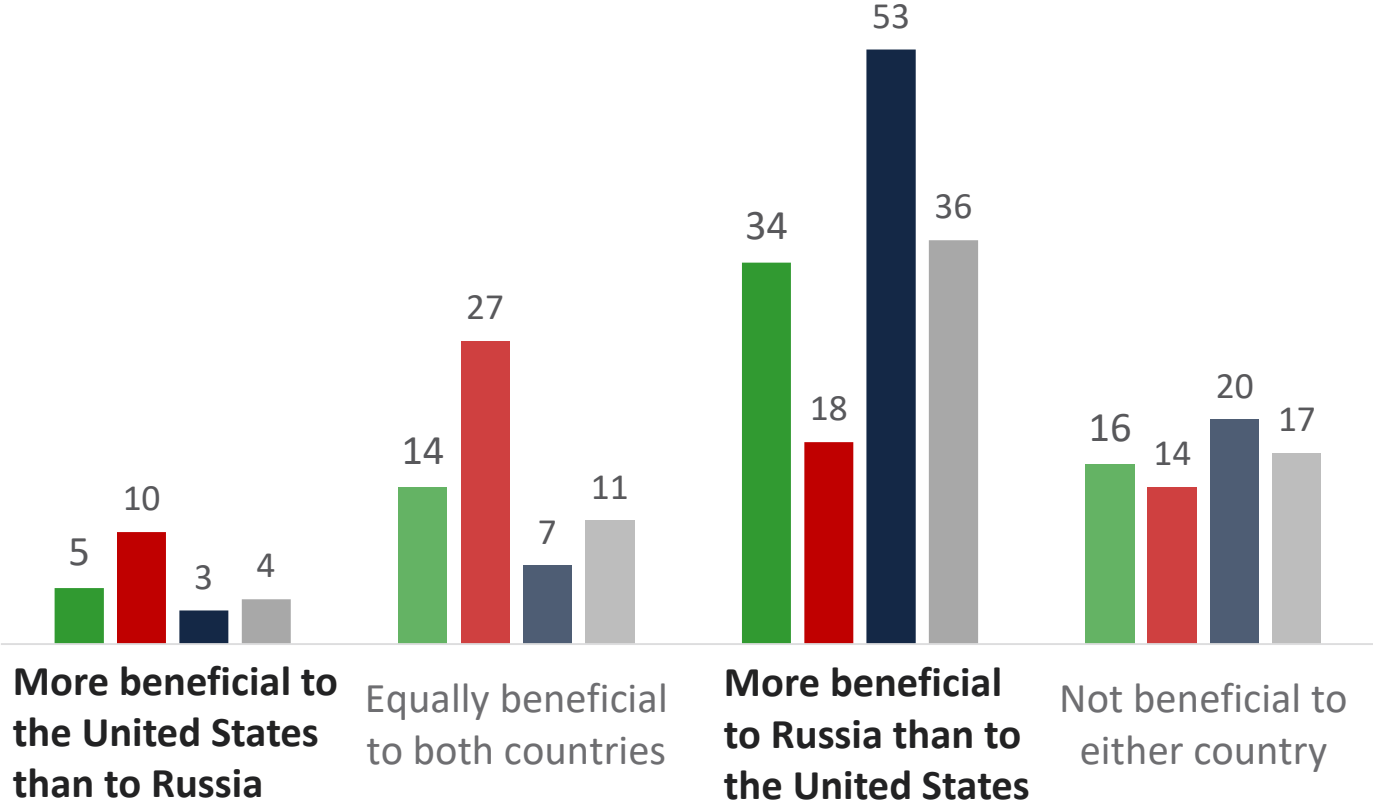
HELSINKI SUMMIT FALLOUT

Please indicate which statement you agree with more.

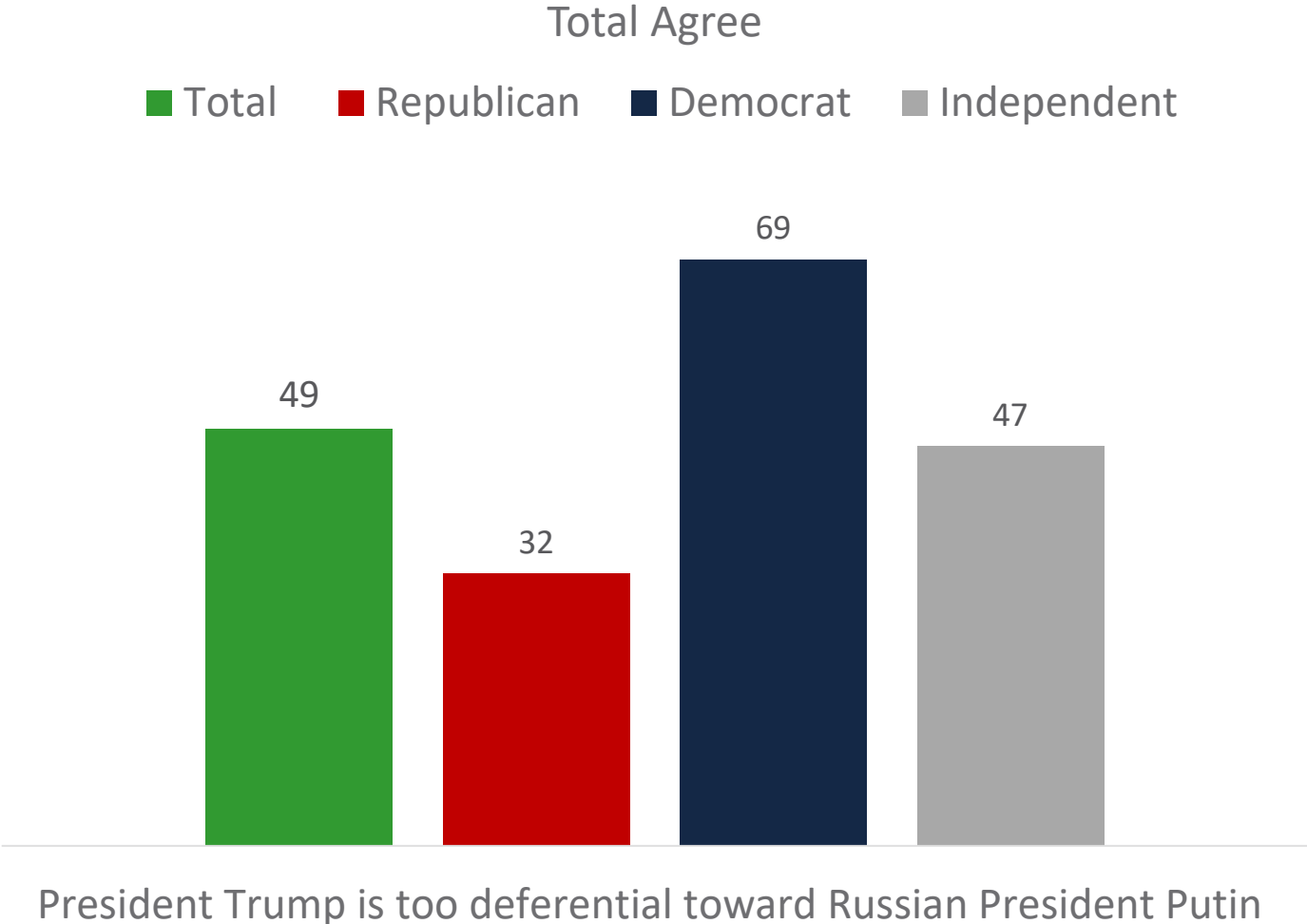

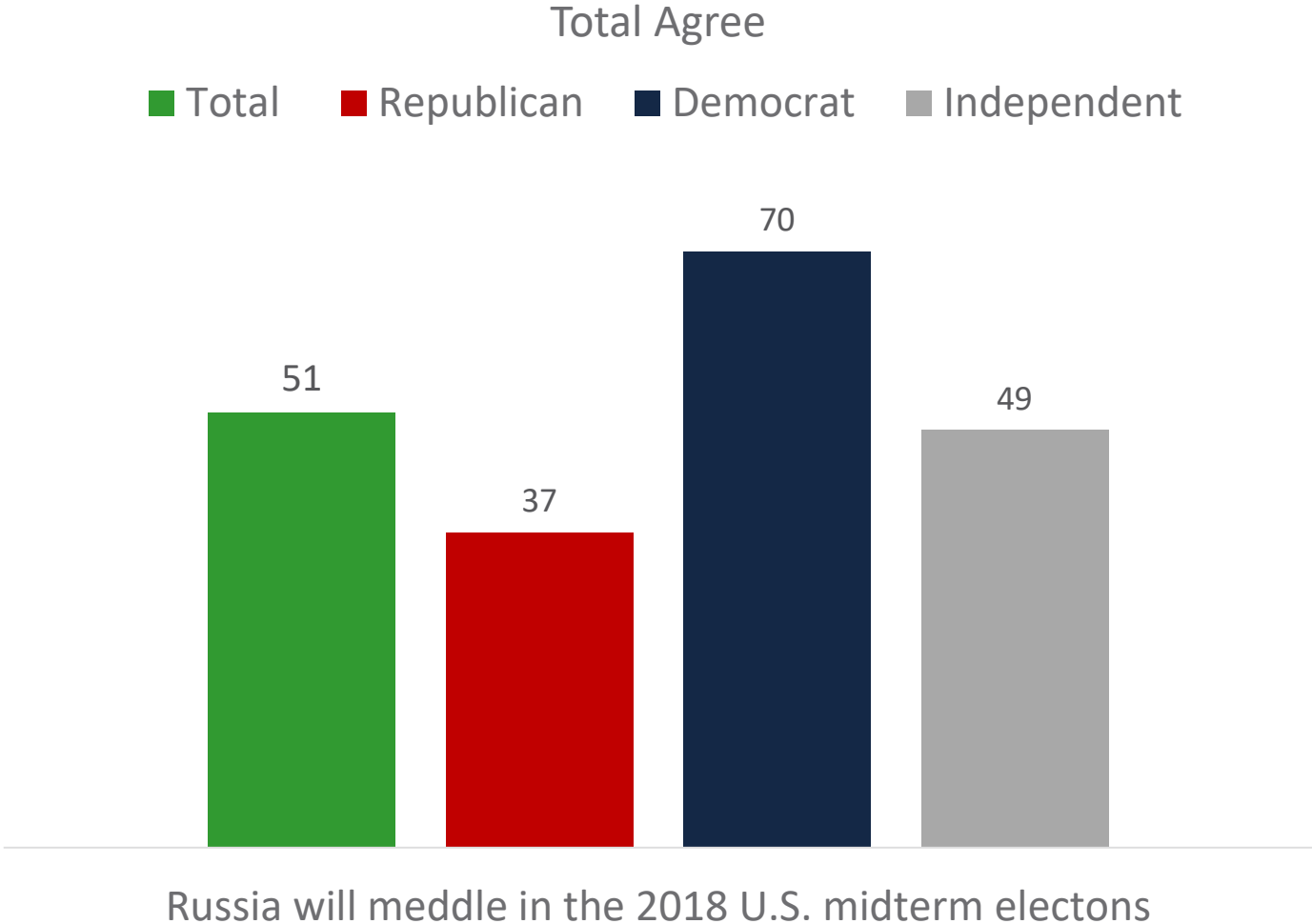
Half of all Americans believe Trump is too deferential toward Putin

Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?



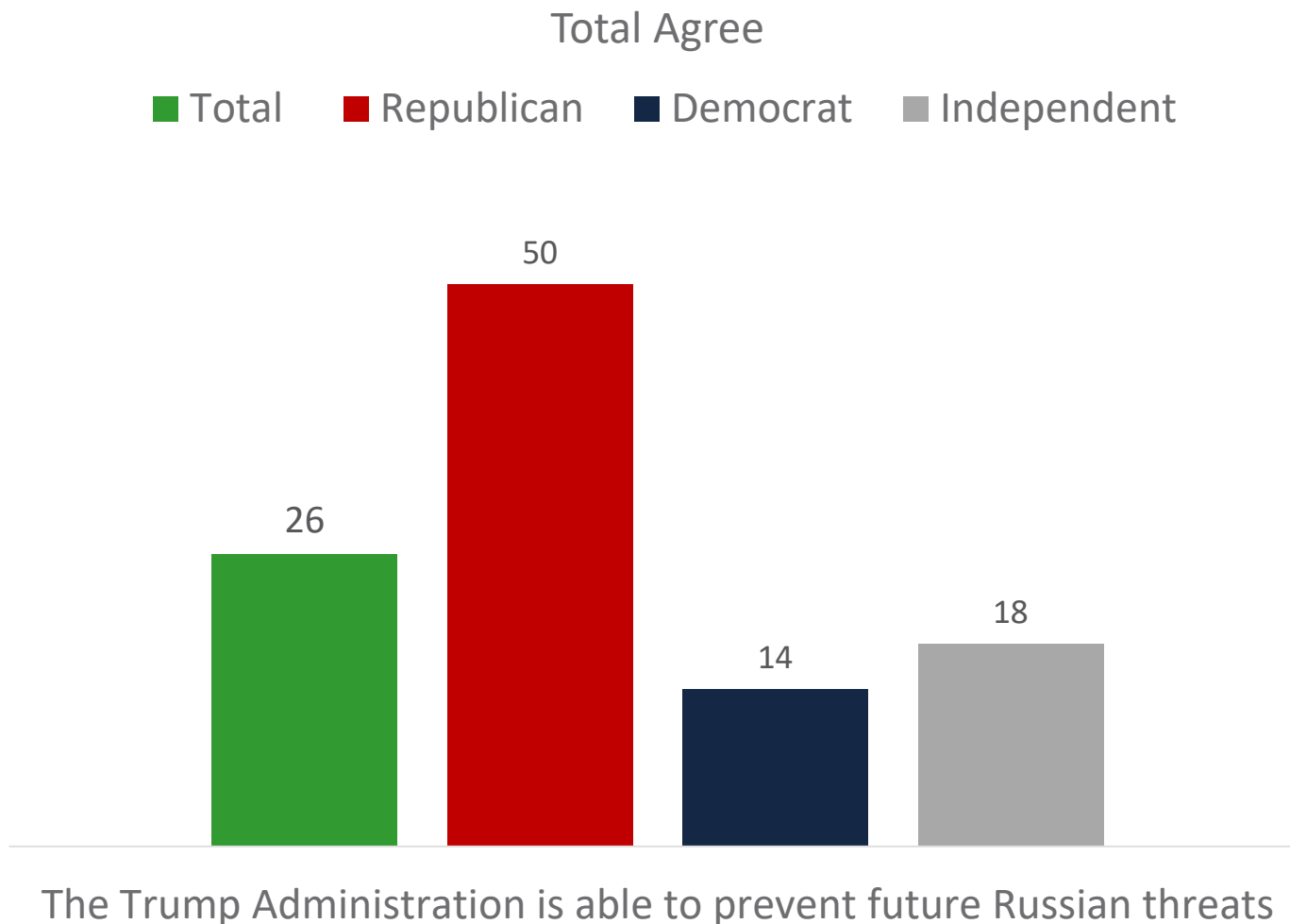
Half the country also believes Russia will meddle again in the 2018 election...
