




In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?






### **Approval by Demographic**






### Kavanaugh's favorability has only slightly declined since the allegations of his sexual misconduct went public last week.



### Views on local teachers are largely positive...




Teachers in your local public school district

Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?




Public school teachers are paid fairly
