The precision of the Reuters/Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval.


In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus the following percentage points


Main Problems

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?





Main Problem Facing America




Parties are split on their top issues

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?







Q. How familiar are you with the following public figures, taking into account all the ways you may have heard about them?




Democrats strongly believe there was collusion with Russia while Republicans think the investigations into Trump are politically motivated.

Total agree




Of those who are familiar with Mueller's report, the majority say they still have questions and would like to see a full release.

Which comes closest to your opinion about the information regarding the Mueller report released to date?




The report, however, has not changed people's opinion about the Trump campaign or Russia's involvement in the 2016 election...
