




In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?

Most Important Problem Facing America









VIEWS ON THE SAFETY OF THE MEASLES VACCINE




Americans overwhelmingly believe both that measles are dangerous and that the measles vaccination is safe.

It therefore makes sense that most think all children should be required to be vaccinated for measles, regardless of their parents' objections.




Question: In your opinion, should all children be required to get the measles vaccination... (% Yes, required)



ATTITUDES TOWARD ASKING ABOUT CITIZENSHIP ON THE 2020 CENSUS




Most Americans approve asking about citizenship during the 2020 Census, with Republicans more strongly in favor than Democrats or Independents.



Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the Census asking about people's citizenship status? (% Approve)



Republicans are also more likely to believe the practice is standard and intended to improve counts of people everywhere, while Democrats are more likely to believe it is designed to enforce immigration laws and undercount immigrants.
