In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus the following percentage points



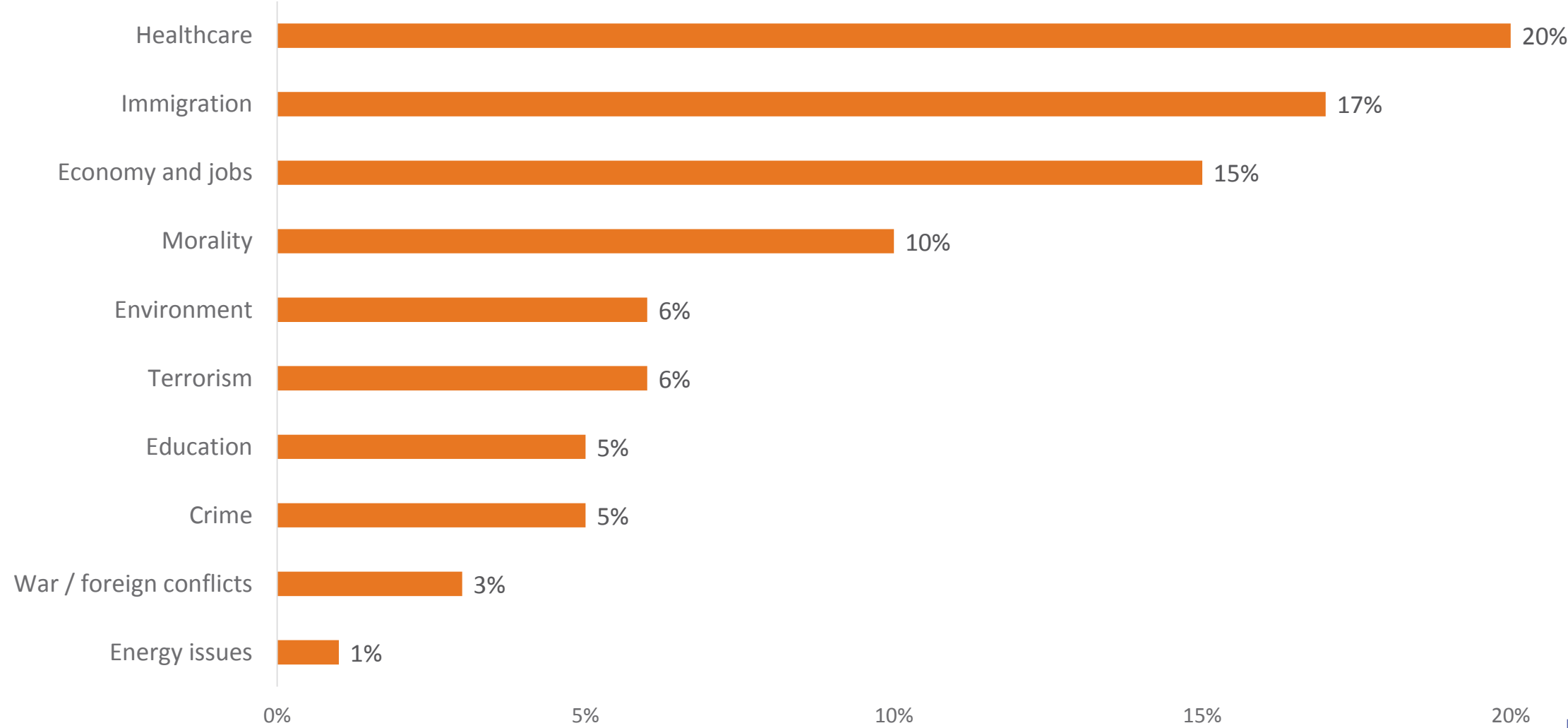

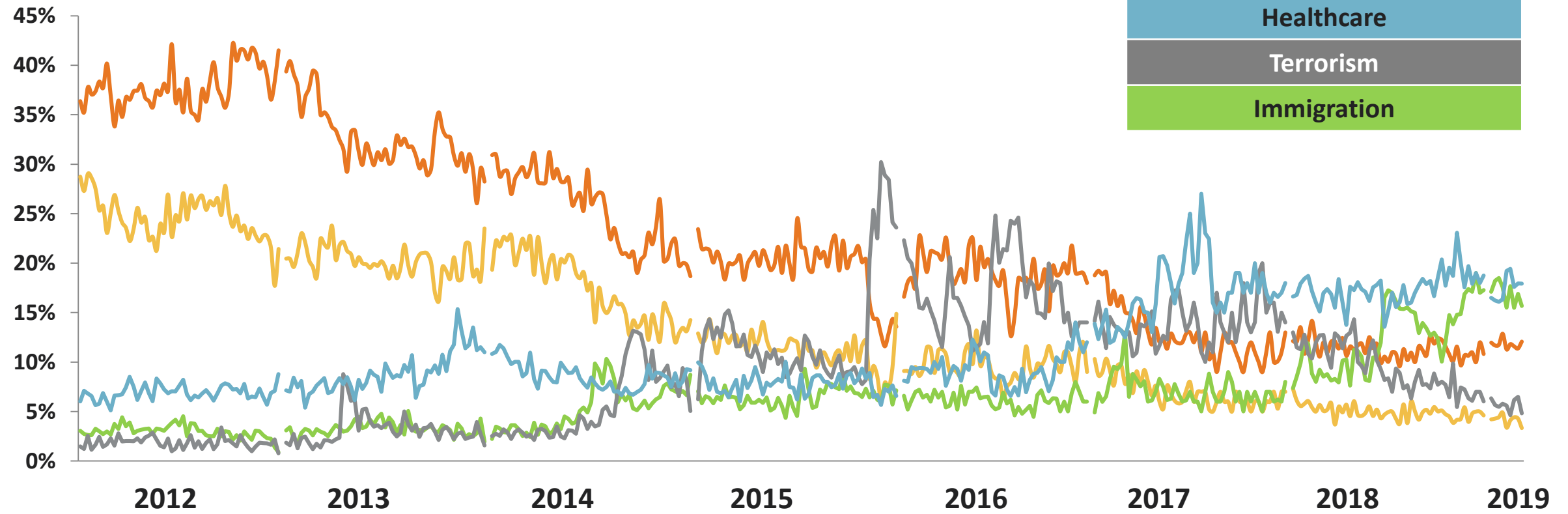

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the US today?



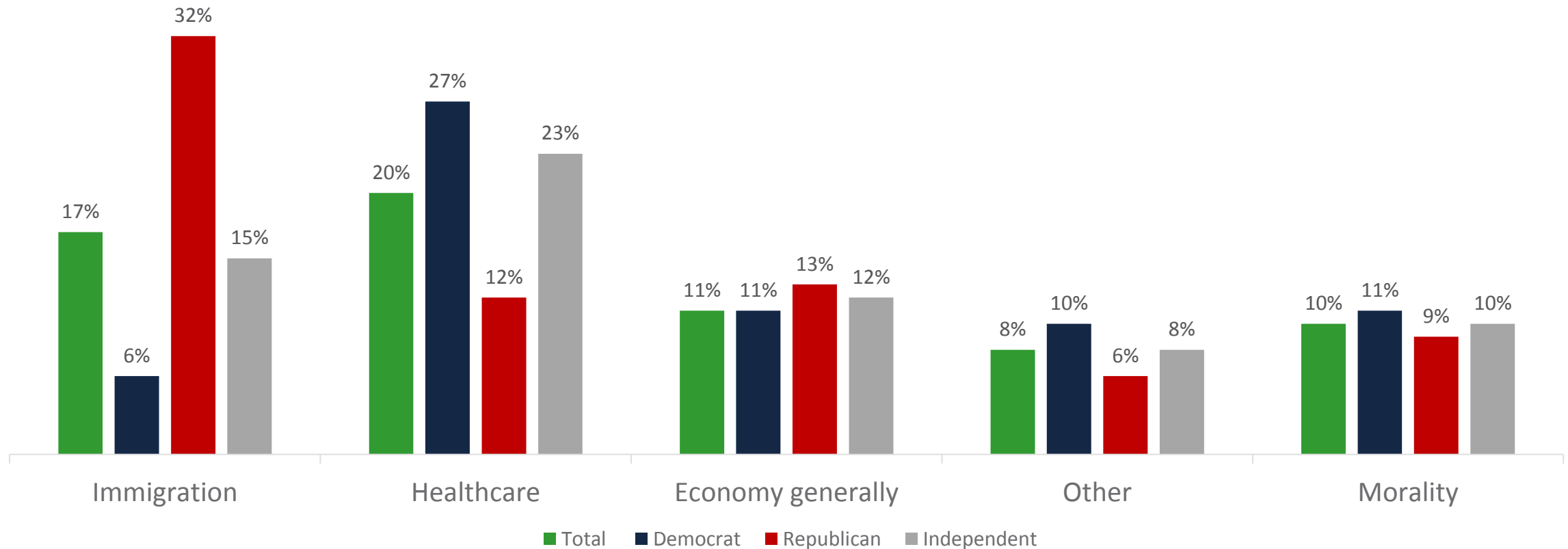
Most Important Problem Facing America

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the U.S. today?



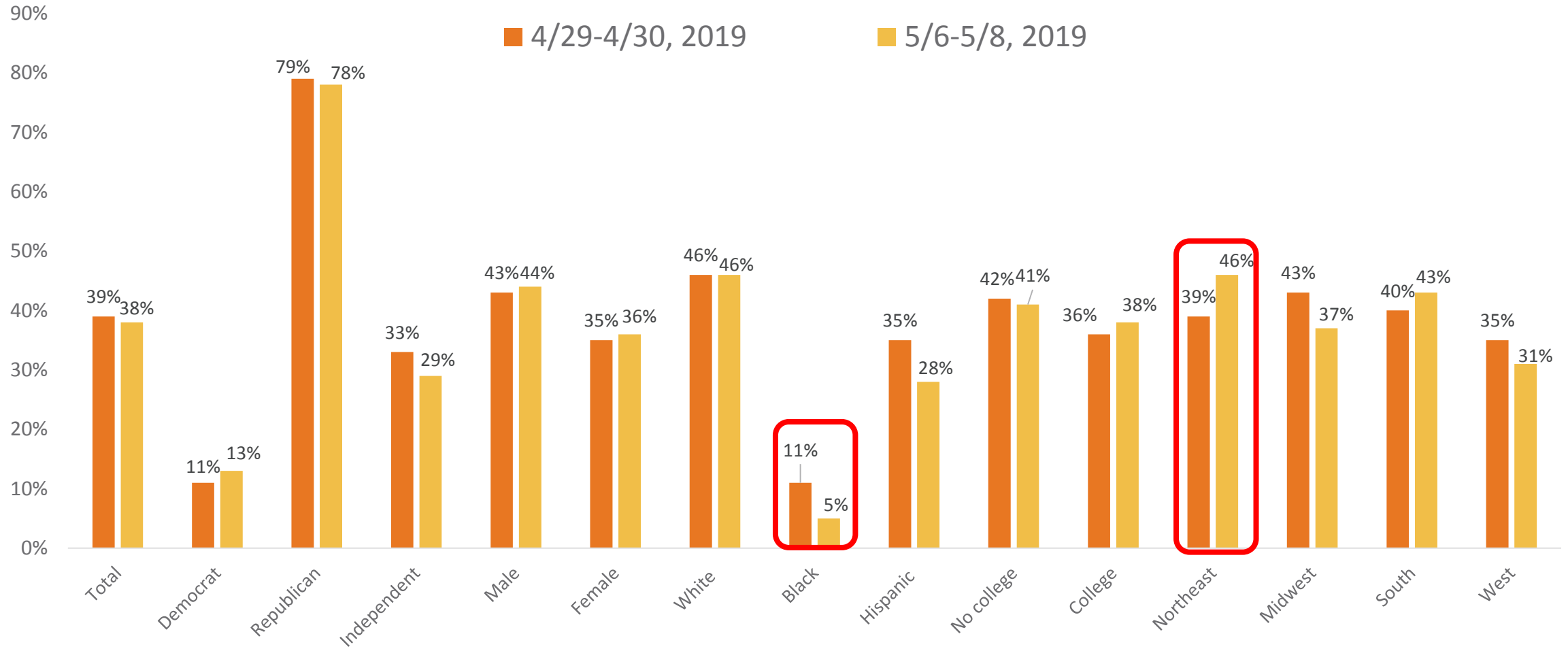
Parties are split on their top issues

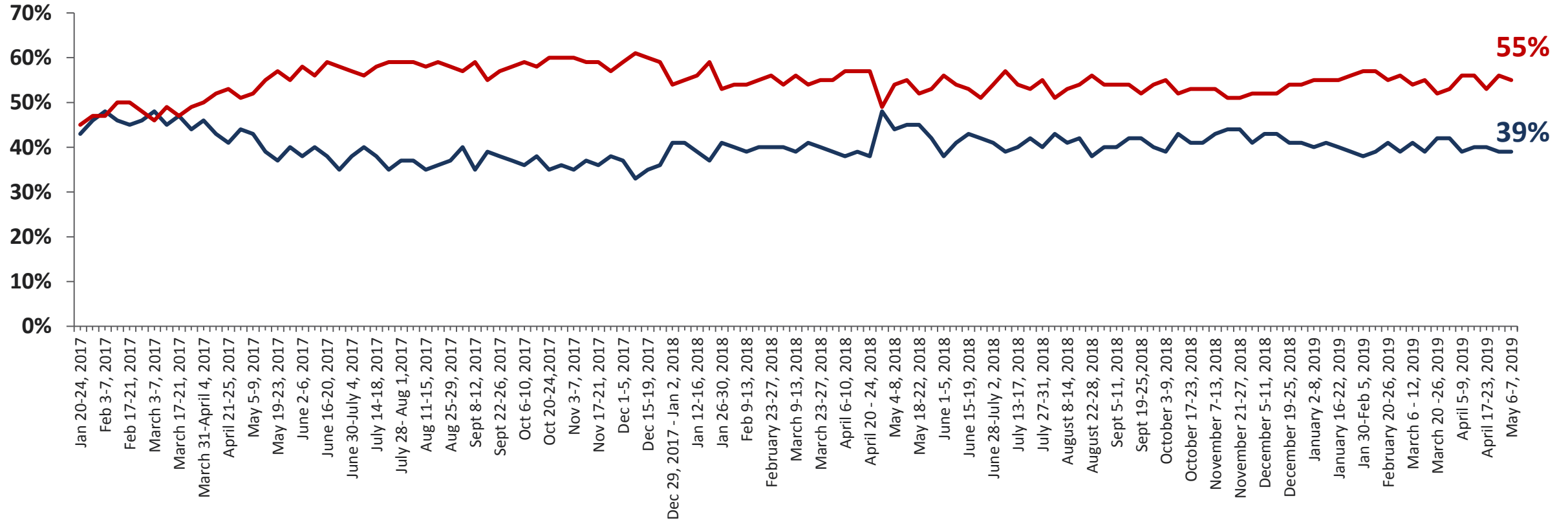
Overall, do you approve or disapprove about the way Donald Trump is handling his job as President? *Approve*

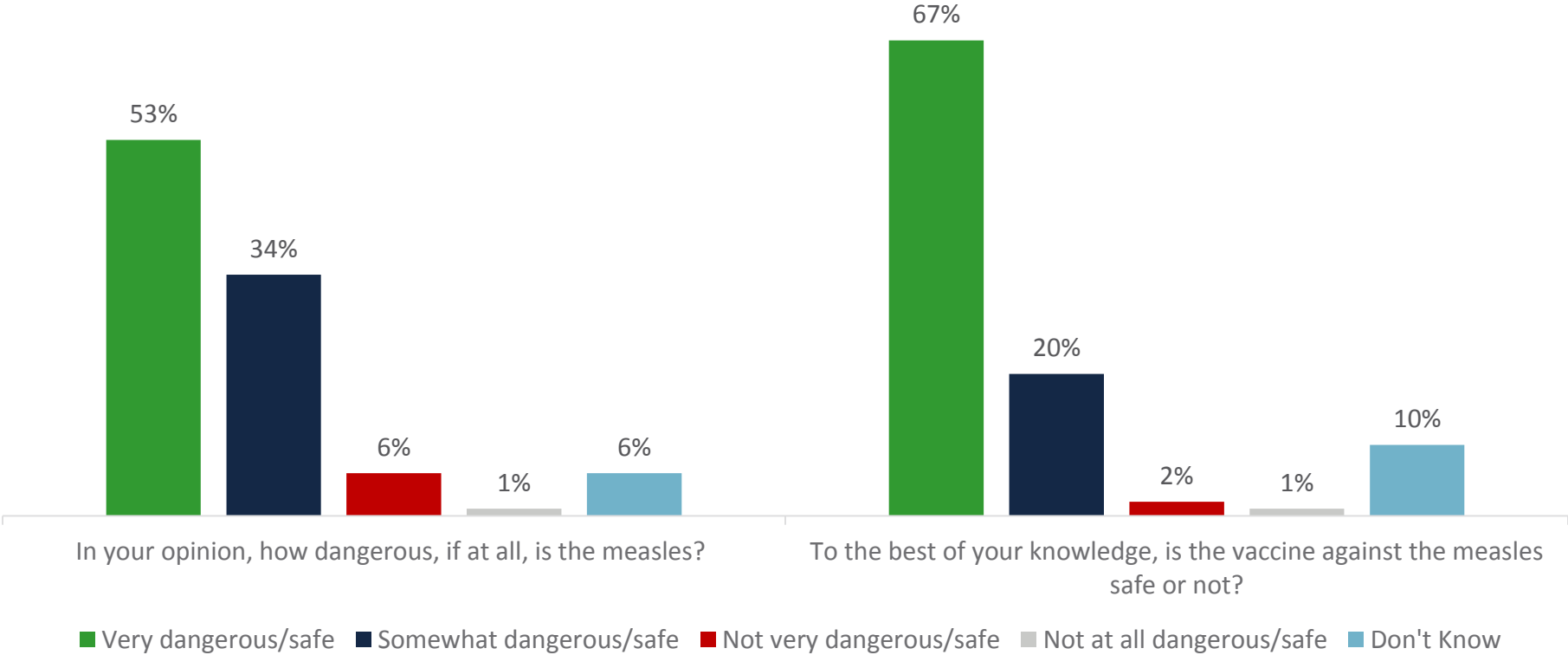

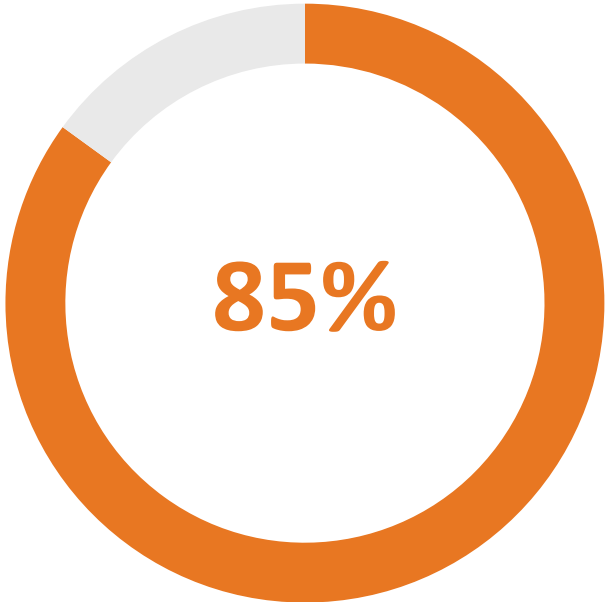

VIEWS ON THE SAFETY OF THE MEASLES VACCINE

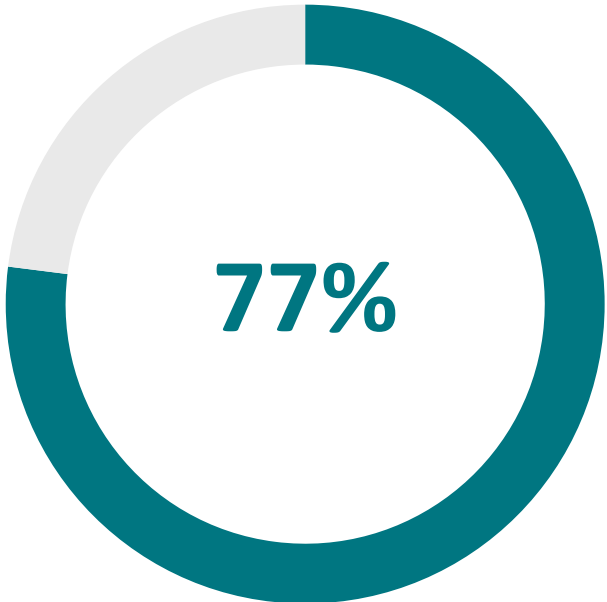
Americans overwhelmingly believe both that measles are dangerous and that the measles vaccination is safe.

...unless they are prohibited for medical reasons?

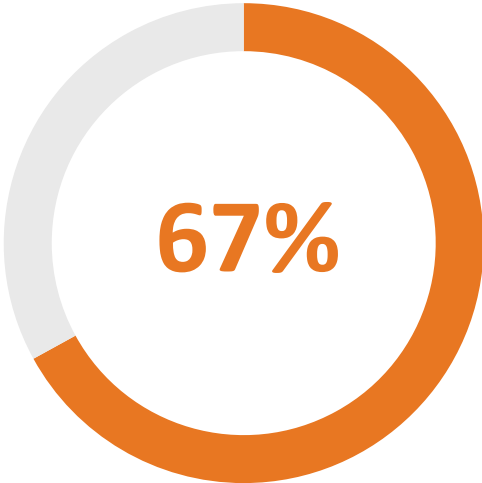


...even if their parents personally object to vaccinations?

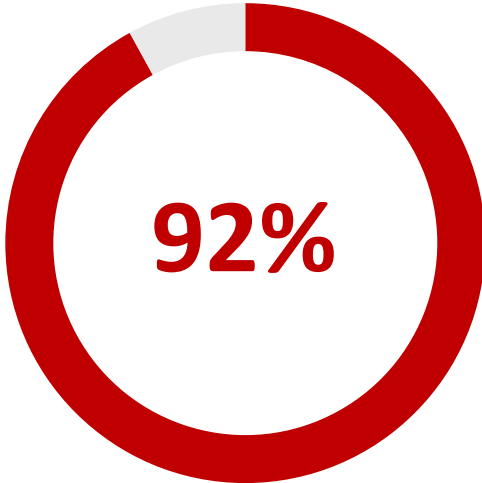
Question: In your opinion, should all children be required to get the measles vaccination... (% Yes, required)

ATTITUDES TOWARD ASKING ABOUT CITIZENSHIP ON THE 2020 CENSUS

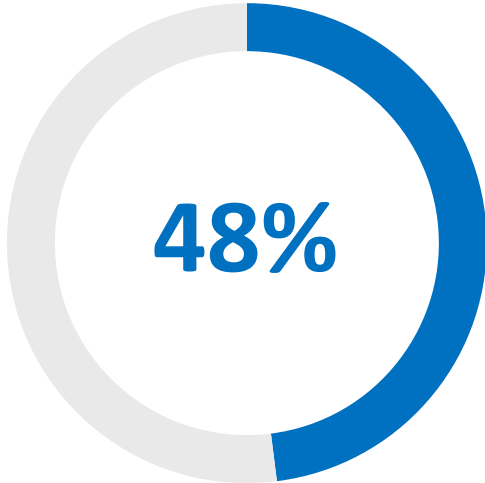
Most Americans approve asking about citizenship during the 2020 Census, with Republicans more strongly in favor than Democrats or Independents.



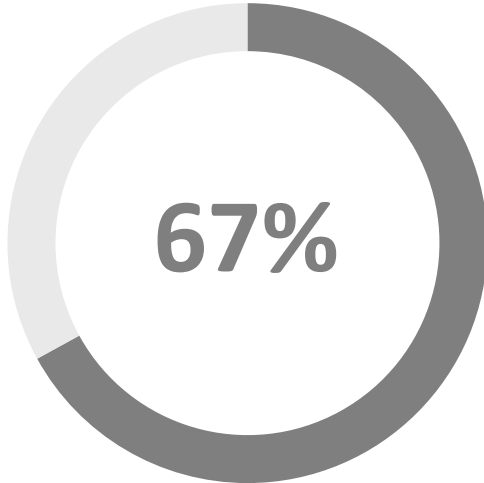
All Americans



Republicans



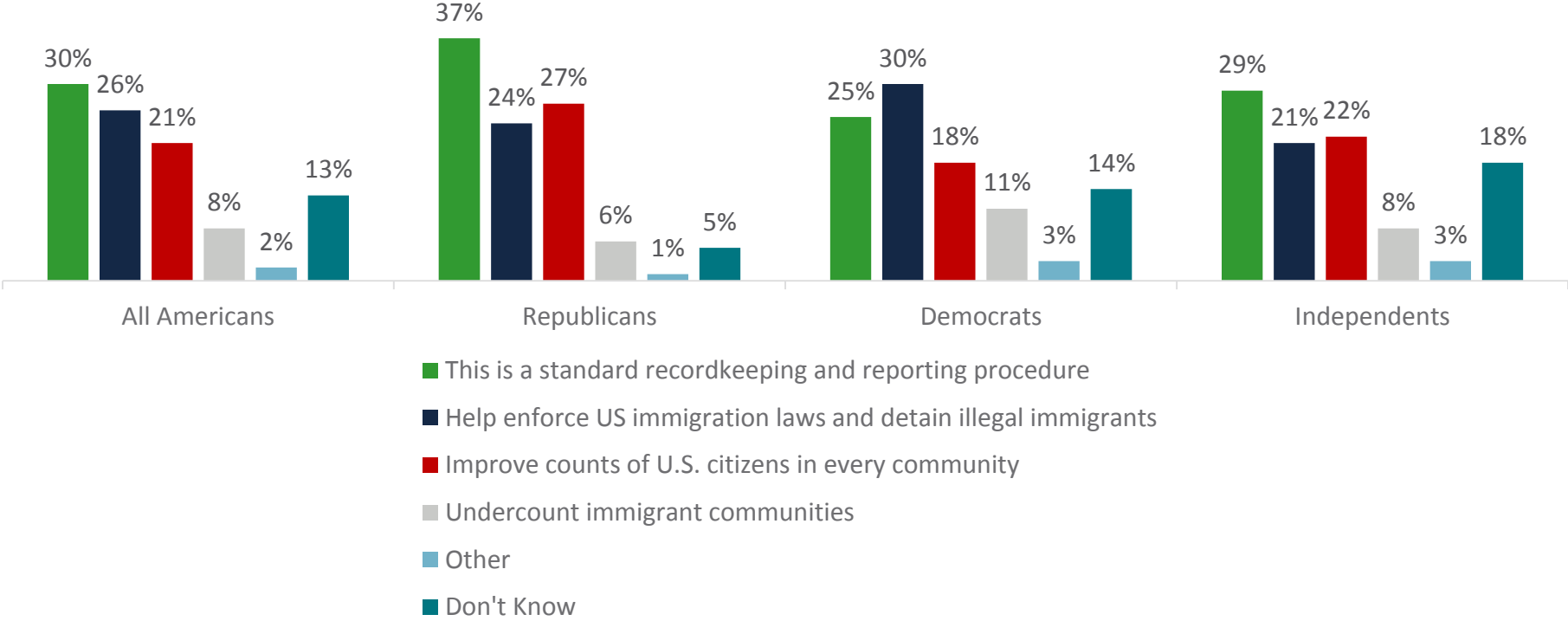
Democrats
