In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus the following percentage points



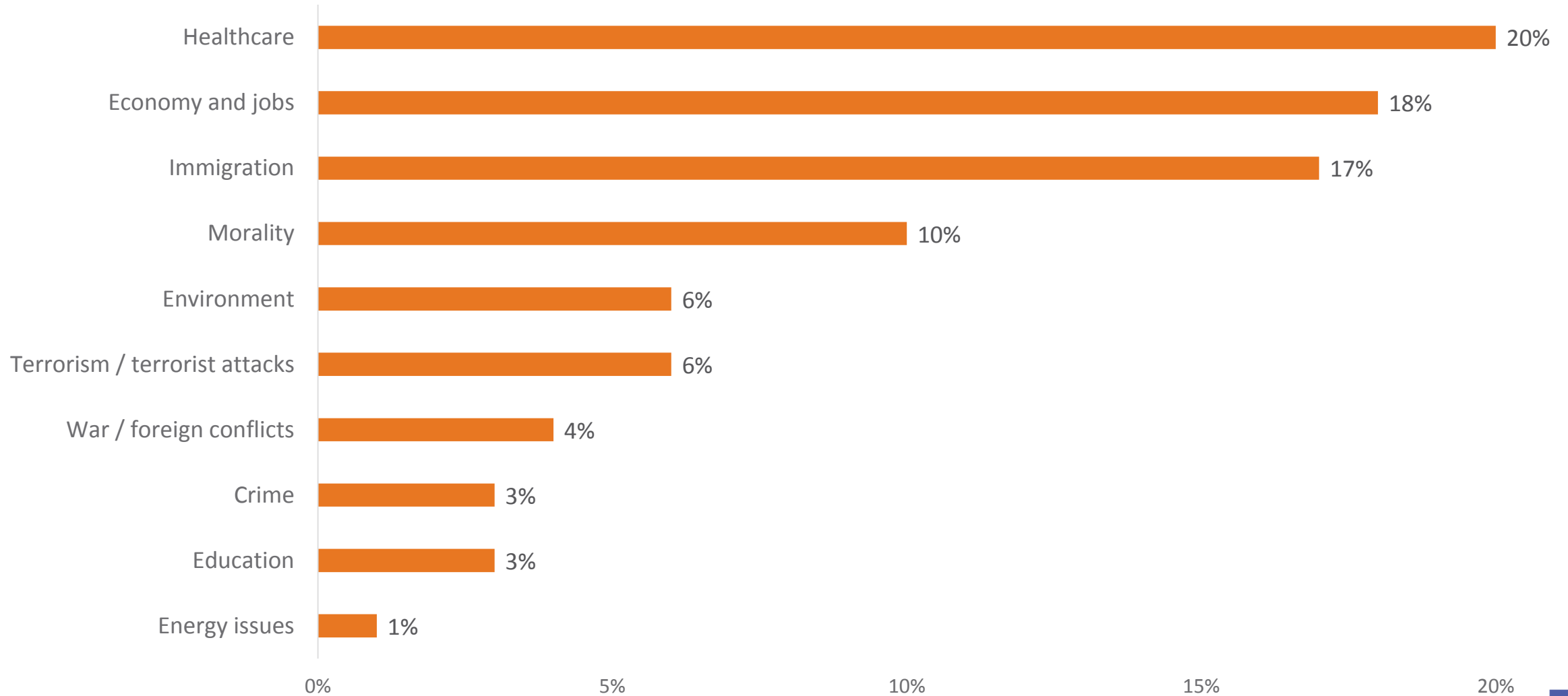

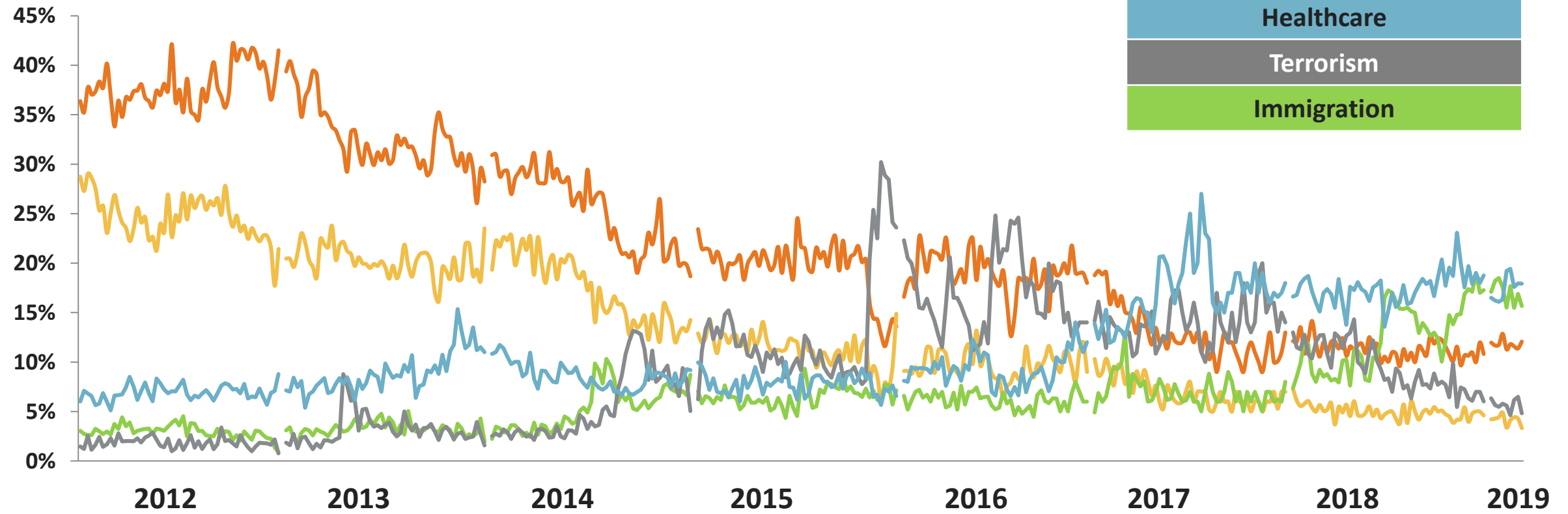

Most Important Problem Facing America

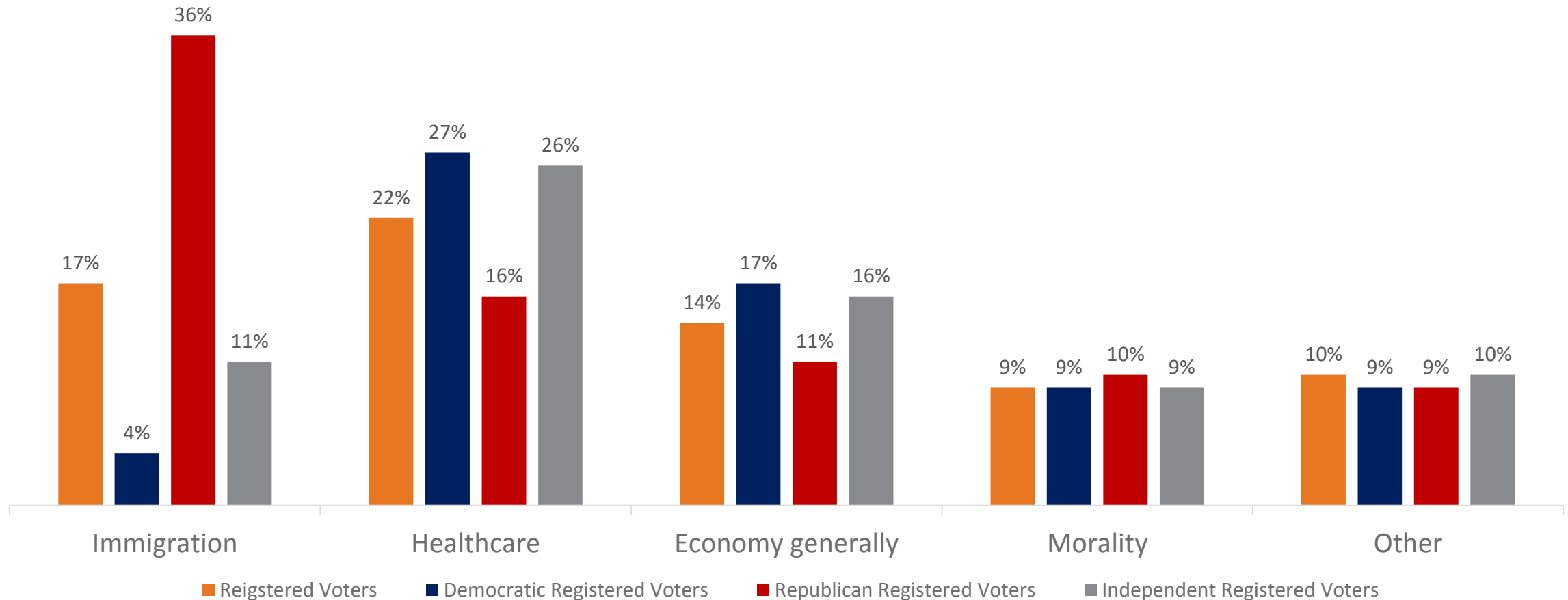
In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the U.S. today?

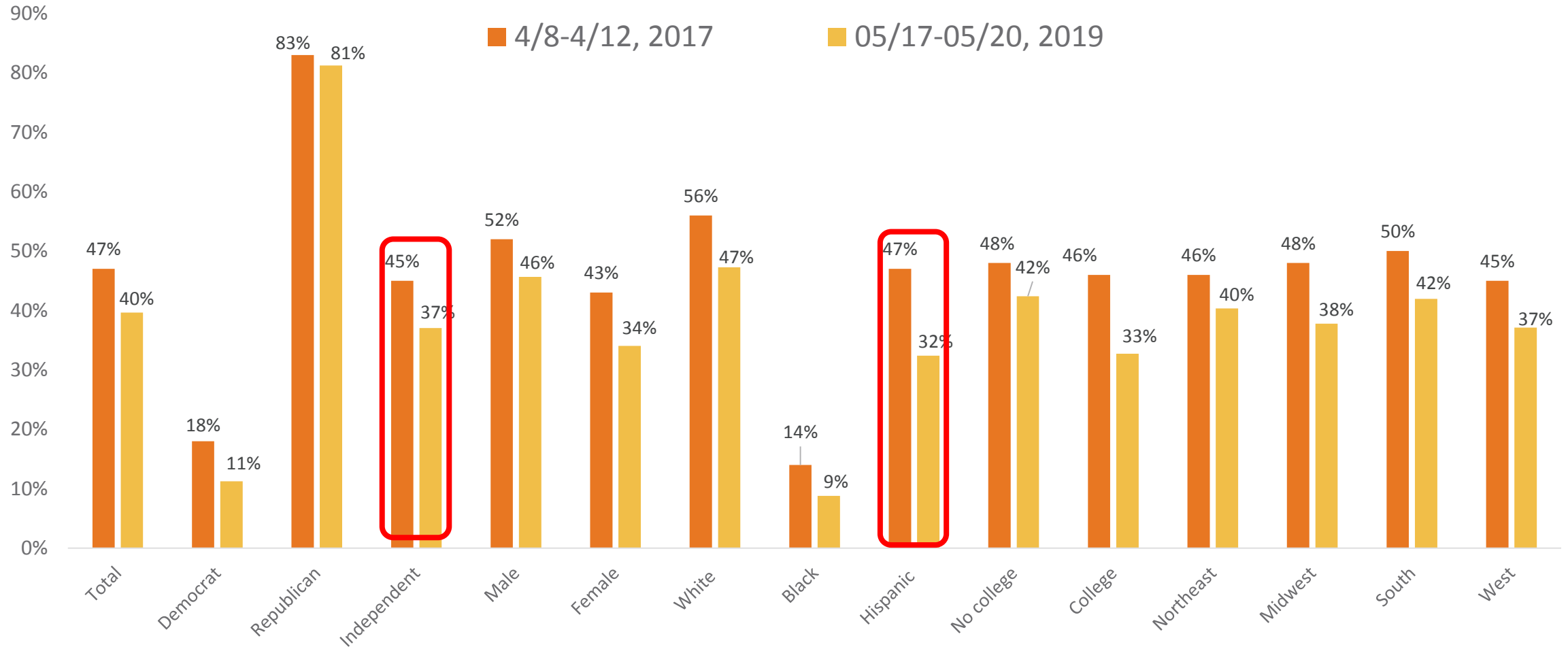
Parties are split on their top issues

Approval by Demographic

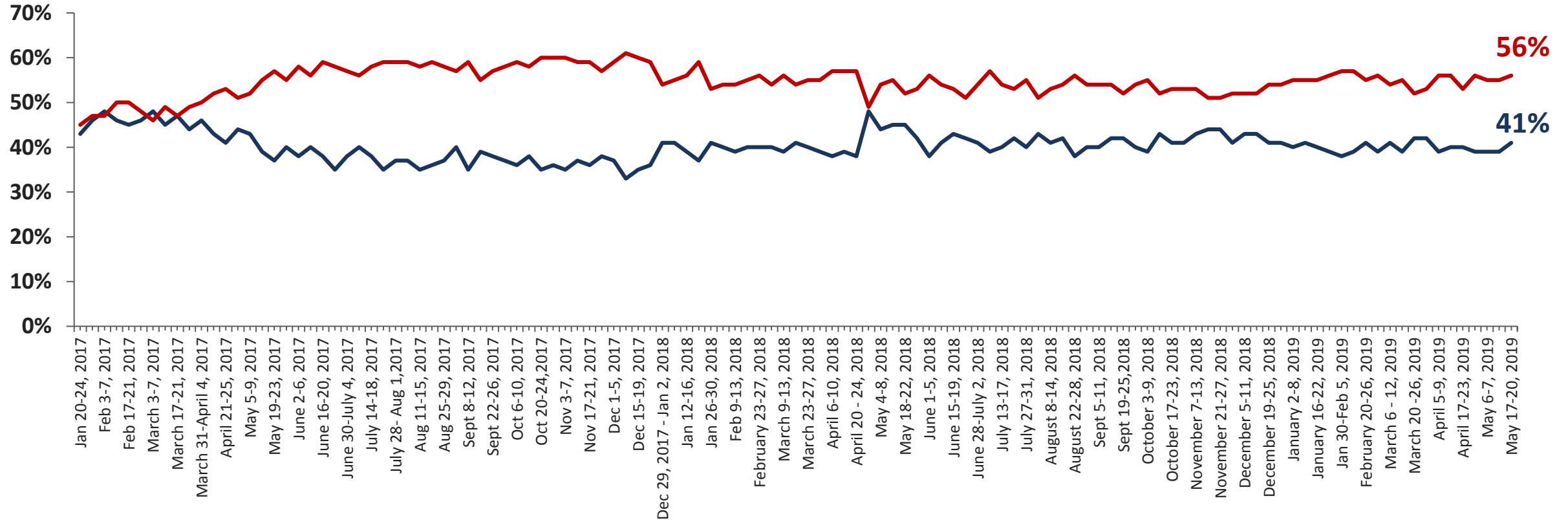
Overall, do you approve or disapprove about the way Donald Trump is handling his job as President? *Approve*

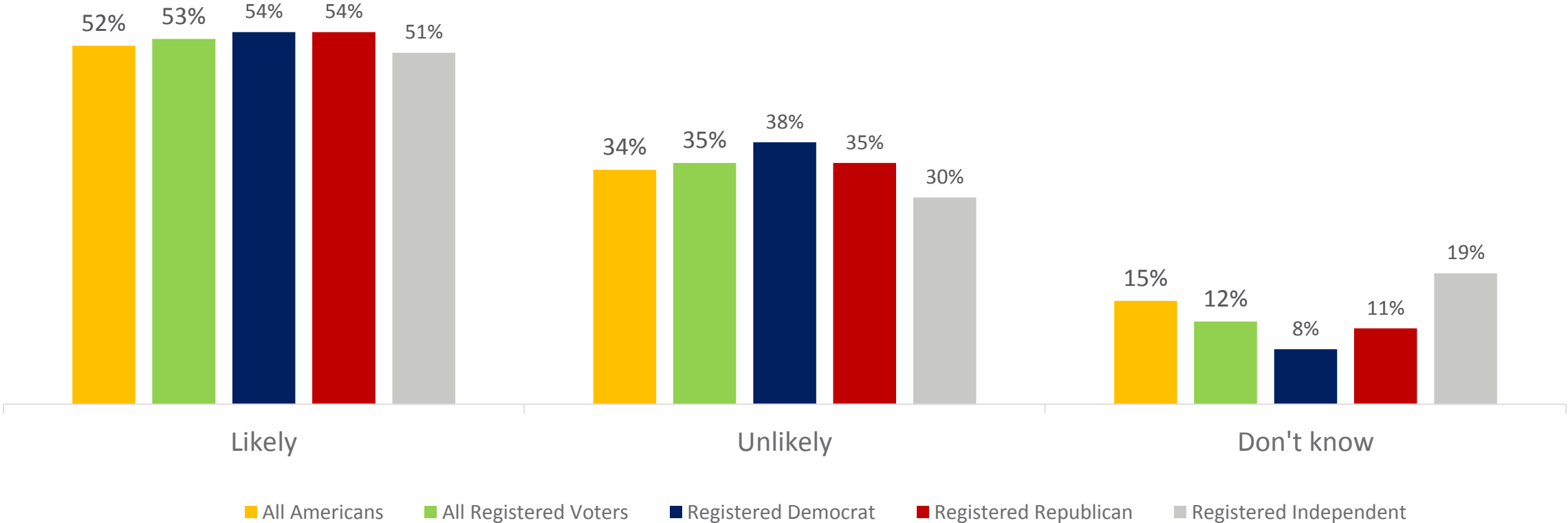

IRAN & LIKELIHOOD OF MILITARY CONFLICT

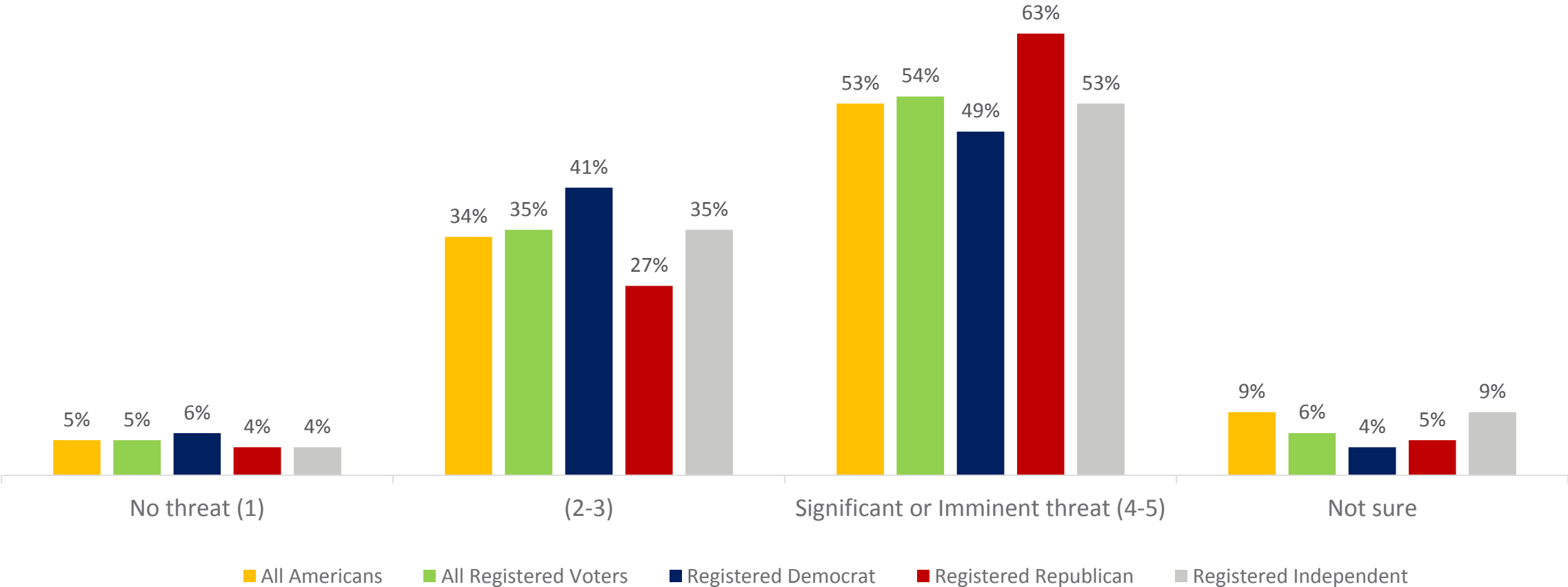
Half of Americans believe that it is likely America will go to war with Iran in the next few years.

How likely, if at all, do you believe it is that United States will go to war with the following countries within the next few years? (Iran)



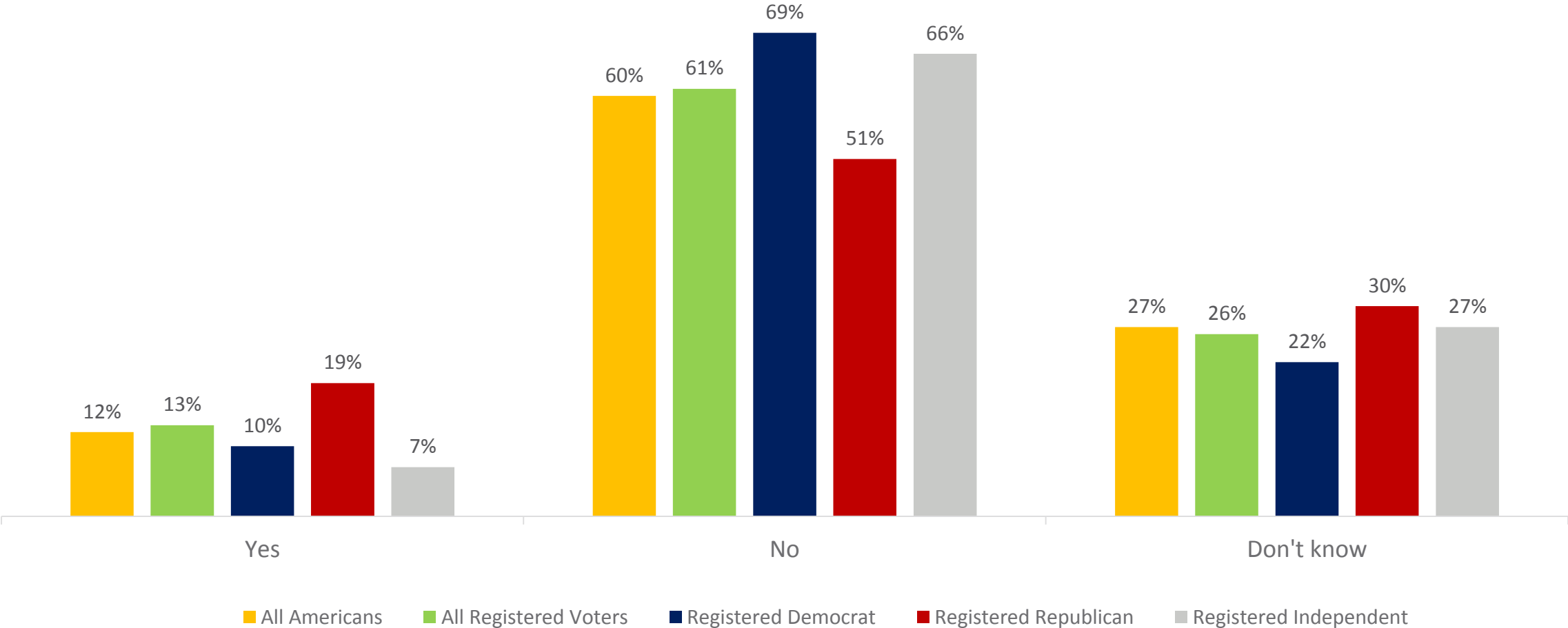
About the same amount view Iran as a significant or imminent threat.

But Americans do not support conducting a preemptive attack on Iranian military interests.

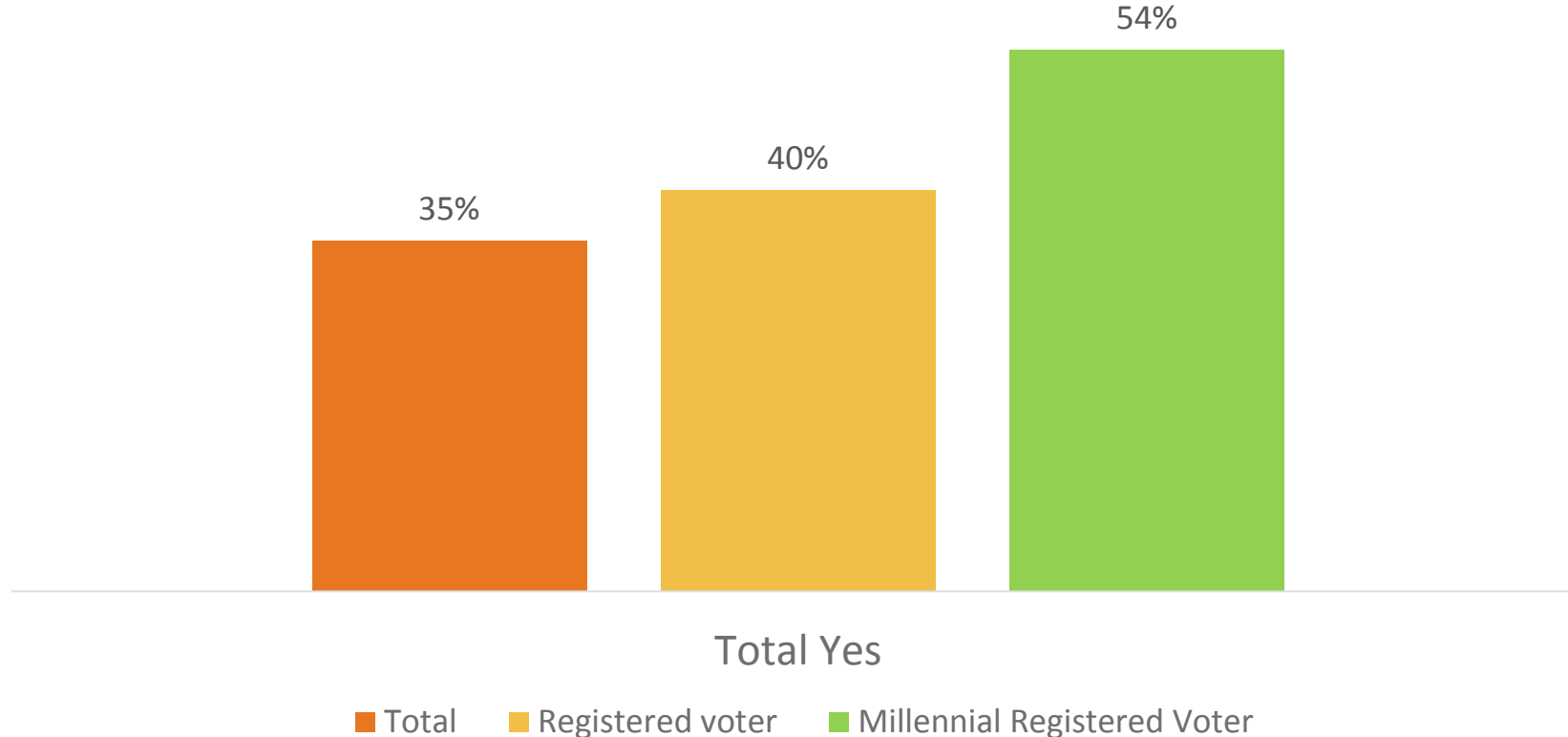
In your opinion, should the U.S. conduct a preemptive attack on Iranian military interests?

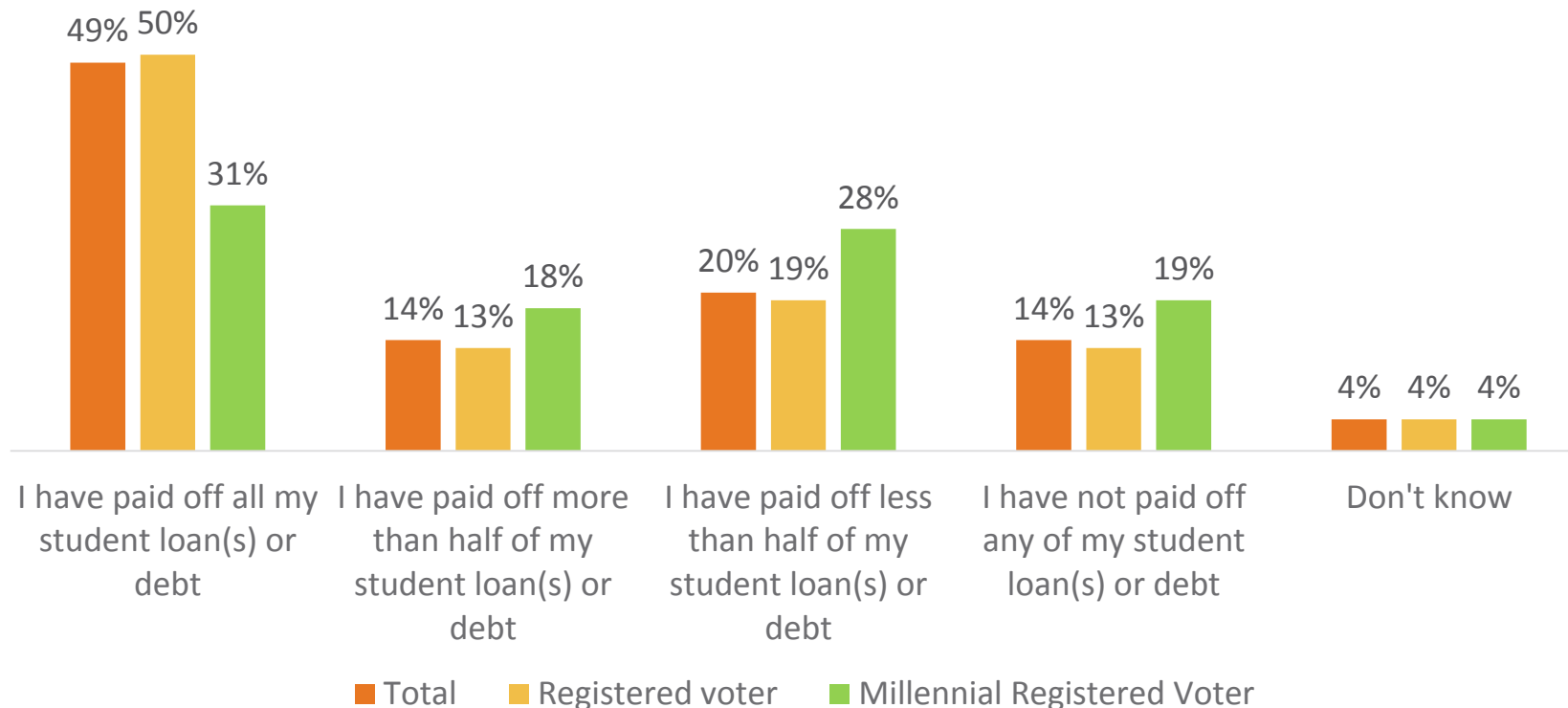
Over half of millennial registered voters report taking out student loans...

Did you borrow any money to help pay for your education?



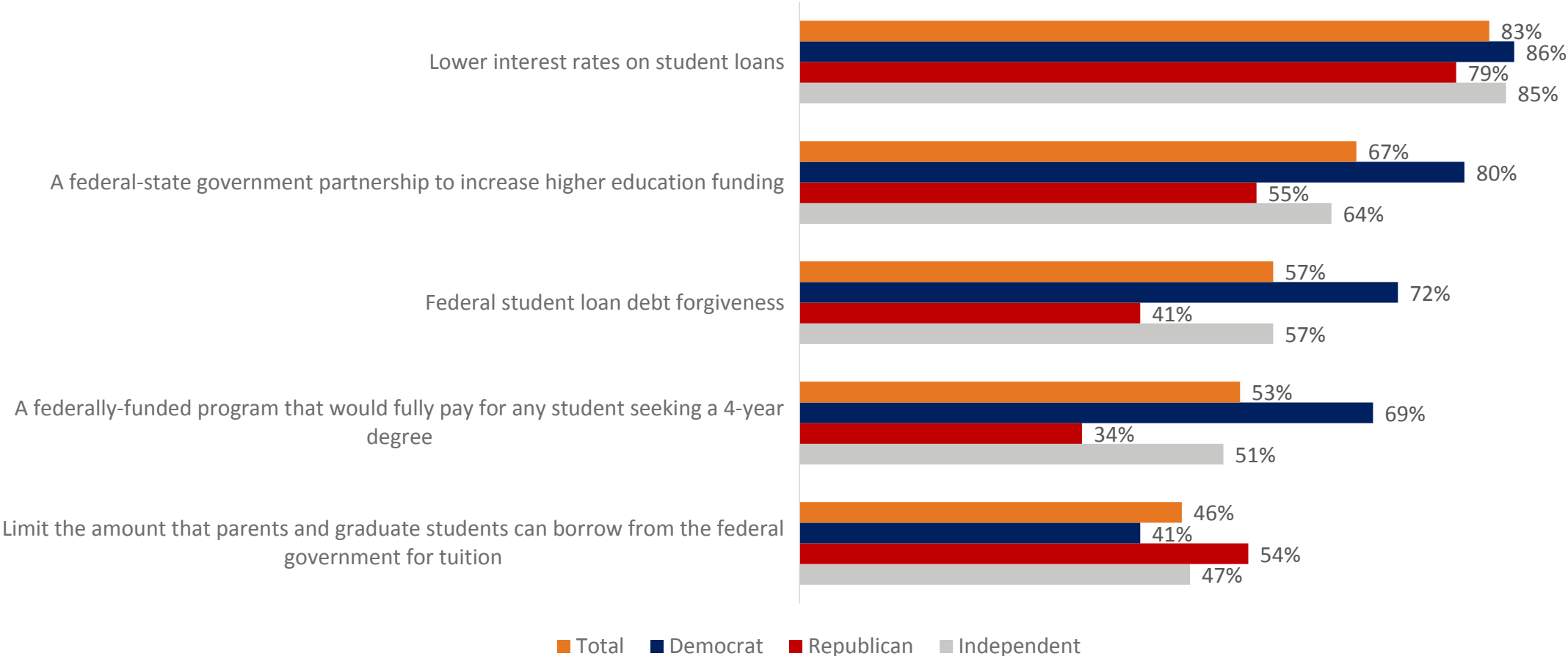
...but less than a third say they have paid the money they borrowed back.

Thinking about the money you borrowed to pay for your education, which of the following applies to you?

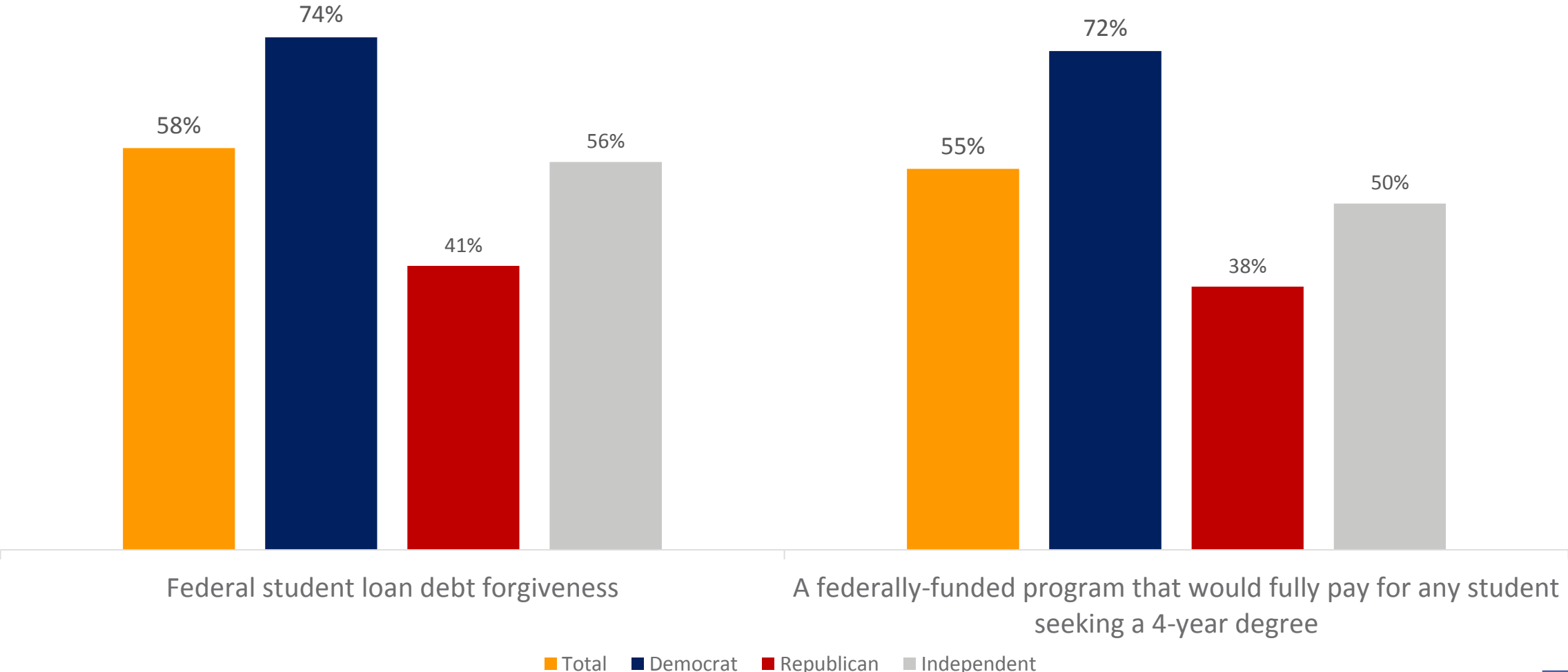


Parties are equally supportive of lower interest rates on student loans, but split on support for other policies
