

Browne Jacobson Shared Services Survey of Local Authorities Topline Results 07 January 2011

- 5 minute telephone survey of senior local authority officers in England.
- Fieldwork conducted between 29 November and 17 December 2010.
- Results are based on 150 interviews (76 corporate level and 74 service head level).
- Quotas set for local authority type and council position (corporate/ service head split).
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of 'don't know/ not stated' response categories.
- An asterisk (*) indicates a value of less than 0.5% but not zero.
- Please note that some figures are displayed as numbers rather than percentages where the base is small.
- Data is unweighted.
