- CANADIANS' VIEWS ON EUTHANASIA -

This National Angus Reid Poll was conducted by telephone between October 23rd and 28th, 1997 among a representative cross-section of 1,515 Canadian adults.

These data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional and age/sex composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to the 1991 and 1996 Census data.

With a national sample of 1,515, one can say with 95 percent certainty that the results are within ± 2.5 percentage points of what they would have been had the entire adult Canadian population been polled. The margin of error will be larger within regions and for other subgroupings of the survey population.

CANADIANS' VIEWS ON EUTHANASIA

A large majority of Canadians – three in four – support the concept of terminally ill people having the "right to die", echoing the level of support measured in a 1993 Angus Reid survey.

This finding emerged from a National Angus Reid Poll conducted among a representative cross-section of 1,515 Canadian adults between October 23rd and 28th, 1997.

Below are the highlights of the survey:

- ♦ Three-quarters (76%) of surveyed Canadians said they support the "right to die" for people who wish to end their own lives rather than enduring the full course of a terminal illness, versus 21 percent who voiced opposition to this idea. This level of support is identical to that measured in a March 1993 sounding on this same question. (Table 1)
- ♦ Support for euthanasia for the terminally ill is widespread among Canadians from all walks of life. Regionally, the level of support ranges from the two-thirds mark in Manitoba/Saskatchewan and Atlantic Canada (68% and 65% respectively) to fully eight in ten residents of Quebec and British Columbia (84% and 82%).
- From a generational perspective, support for the "right to die" for the terminally ill declines with age: while fully eight in ten (81%) respondents under 35 expressed support, this number decreased among those 55 and older (69%, though still a solid majority).
