Employed Canadians Consider Organizations' Informational Assets

Methodology

- ➤ These are the findings of an Ipsos-Reid survey of employed Canadians conducted from January 12th to January 16th, 2006.
- ➤ A representative randomly selected sample of 692 employed Canadians were interviewed by via an online survey instrument. The results are considered accurate to within +/-3.7%, 19 times out of 20.




Key Findings

- Two-thirds (66%) feel a major part of their organization's value is based upon its information assets.
- And three in four (73%) feel their organization considers information among its most valuable assets.
- But one-third (34%) don't feel their organization:
 - o Has established policies and guidelines that limit how employees may use the organization's information assets during and after their employment; nor
 - o Has established policies and guidelines that limit how employees may use the organization's information assets during and after their employment.
- Further, half (47%) say their organization does not regularly review information asset guidelines with employees.
- Half (50%) believe their organization would not be able to stop past employees from using information assets with other organizations.
- And nearly half (44%) don't think their organization would be willing to take legal action to protect their information assets from being used by former employees.



Two-thirds (66%) Feel A Major Part Of Their Organization's Value Is Based Upon Its Information Assets...


Agree/Disagree: A major part of the value of my organization's business is based upon its information assets...

Agree/Disagree: My organization believes information is among its most valuable assets...










My organization has established policies and guidelines that limit how employees may use the organization's information assets during and after their employment...



My organization clearly communicates the policies and guidelines that are established to limit how employees may use information assets during and after their employment ...




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And Half (47%) Say Their Organization Does Not Regularly Review Information Asset Guidelines With Employees...


Agree/Disagree: My organization reviews with its employees, at least annually, the policies and guidelines it has established to protect its information assets...





Half (50%) Believe Their Organization Would Not Be Able To Stop Past Employees From Using Information Assets With Other Organizations...


Agree/Disagree: If an employee were to use my organization's information assets in another organization after their employment ends, my current organization would not be able to do much about it...
