## Despite Being Most Worried About Fire In Their Home, Only 56% Of Homeowners Have a Fire Escape Plan for Their Family

**Toronto, ON** – According to a new Ipsos Reid poll conducted on behalf of RBC Insurance, when it comes to insuring their home, more insured Canadian homeowners are concerned about the possibility of fire (78%) as opposed to theft (15%) or flood and water damage (7%).

Despite this concern, only 56% of insured Canadian homeowners indicate that they have an 'escape plan' for their family in the event of a fire. Moreover, one-half (51%) of those that do have a plan say that they've never practiced the plan, while 28% practiced it over a year ago, and just 22% have practiced it within the past year.

On a more positive note, almost all (99%) report that they have one or more smoke detectors in their home. Still, only seven in ten (71%) have a fire extinguisher, and less than half (47%) have a carbon monoxide detector. Just four in ten (38%) have a fire box for protecting documents and valuables from a fire.

These are the findings of an Ipsos Reid poll conducted on behalf of RBC Insurance from August 5 to August 8, 2008. This online survey of 1136 insured Canadian homeowners was conducted via the Ipsos I-Say Online Panel, Ipsos Reid's national online panel. An unweighted probability sample of this size, with a 100% response rate, would have an estimated margin of error of +/- 3 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would have been had the entire population of insured home owners in Canada been polled.
