Methodology


- These are some of the findings of an Ipsos Reid poll conducted between August 14 and 18, 2009 on behalf of Global Television. For this survey, a sample of 440 adults living in Halifax from Ipsos' Canadian online panel was interviewed online.
- Weighting was then employed to balance demographics and ensure that the sample's composition reflects that of the adult population according to Census data and to provide results intended to approximate the sample universe.
- A survey with an unweighted probability sample of this size and a 100% response rate would have an estimated margin of error of +/-4.7 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would have been had the entire population of this city or region been polled. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error, and measurement error.
- The national "Canadian" results are not representative of the overall Canadian population as the poll was limited to urban centres, with the exception of Newfoundland and Labrador. As such, these results should not be used to generalize to a Canadian population average, but rather as a barometer of attitudes within Canadian cities.

Overall – Most Important Local Issue Facing Your Community




In your view, as a resident of X, what is the most important LOCAL issue facing your community that is the one issue you feel should receive the greatest attention from your local leaders?


Overall – Most Important Local Issue Facing Your Community – Total Canada


Top Issue - Crime




1. In your view, as a resident of X, what is the most important LOCAL issue facing your community that is the one issue you feel should receive the greatest attention from your local leaders?










Overall – Geographic Group Most Identify With














Overall – Level of Approval of the Following – Total Halifax






Overall – Level of Approval of the Following – Total Canada






Level of Approval of The Mayor






Level of Approval of City Council






Level of Approval of My Local City Councilor






Level of Approval of The Police Chief






Level of Approval of Municipal Workers






















City/Local Council Spends My Tax Dollars Wisely






I Am Concerned That Someone In My Family Could Contract The H1N1 Flue (Swine Flu) In The Next Six Months





The Amount of Gang Activity




5. How concerned are you about the following in your community?


The Number of Guns on the Streets



5. How concerned are you about the following in your community? Base: All respondents n=4,393




The Amount of Drug Activity








Voting - Halifax






Voting in Federal Election






Voting in Provincial Election




Level of Engagement in Voting in Federal Election




Level of Engagement in Voting in Federal Election






Level of Engagement in Voting in Provincial Election





Level of Engagement in Voting in Municipal Election



Harbour Cleanup Solution


