

Ipsos Reid/Global News Campbell Address Poll Final Results – October 28, 2010

Methodology

These are the findings of an Ipsos Reid online poll conducted on behalf of Global BC. The poll was fielded October 28, 2010 with a representative sample of 815 adult British Columbia residents, who either watched/heard Premier Gordon Campbell's address or saw/heard media coverage of the address.

A survey with an unweighted probability sample of this size and a 100% response rate would have an estimated margin of error of ± 3.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error will be larger for other sub-groupings of the survey population.

These data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional and age/sex composition reflects that of the actual British Columbia population according to 2006 Census data.

The polling was conducted using Ipsos Reid's "Voice of the West Interactive Forum" – an online panel of more than 6,500 British Columbians who have been randomly recruited to match the overall characteristics of the adult residents of the province.

Important Research Note

This survey was conducted with 815 adult British Columbia residents who either watched/heard Premier Gordon Campbell's address or saw/heard media coverage of the address. The survey respondents are referred to in this report collectively as "British Columbians".

Justification for WHY HST Introduced

Q1. In your view, did Gordon Campbell provide a good justification for WHY the HST (harmonized sales tax) was introduced?

Views of Early Childhood Learning Initiatives

- Q7. In his address, Gordon Campbell talked about a number of initiatives related to early childhood learning, including the following:
 - The addition of 100 StrongStart BC learning centres a program that helps to prepare children under the age of five for school.
 - Beginning next school year, BC will institute voluntary assessments of every five-year old child entering Kindergarten so educators can better tailor educational programs for students during Grades 1 to 4.
 - A commitment that, within the next five years, all children in Grade 4 will be able to read, write and do math at a Grade 4 level.
