




- These are some of the findings of an Ipsos Reid poll conducted between April 18 to April 26, 2011, on behalf of the Toronto Real Estate Board.
- For this survey, a sample of 913 adults from Ipsos' Canadian online panel living in Toronto was interviewed online. Of those, 485 live in the 416 area code while 428 live in the 905 area code.
- Weighting was then employed to balance demographics and ensure that the sample's composition reflects that of the adult population according to Census data and to provide results intended to approximate the sample universe.
- A survey with an unweighted probability sample of this size and a 100% response rate would have an estimated margin of error of +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would have been had the entire population of adults in the GTA been polled.
- All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error, and measurement error.






City Of Toronto Council: On The Right Track Or Headed In The Wrong Direction?


Almost 2/3 Have Awareness of Mayor Ford's Intention to Repeal Toronto Land Transfer Tax...

Three Quarters (75%) of Torontonians Support Mayor Ford's Plan To Repeal Toronto Land Transfer Tax...






Causes For Shortfall Between What The City Collects And What It Spends On Programs And Services...


Causes For Shortfall Between What The City Collects And What It Spends On Programs And Services...




Tier 1 Options Which Should Receive Most Attention To Help Reduce Or Eliminate Budget Shortfall...




Municipal Services And Costs Which Most Influence The Decision To Buy A Home...




Value of programs and services offered by municipality: 'Good' in 416/905... 'Poorer' in 416...


Level Of Fees Paid By Residents For Municipal Programs And Services: 905 Feel More Burdened For Value...
