


### **A Country Deeply Divided:**



On reflection, would you call the past 12 years in Afghanistan a successful mission and outcome for Canada and its NATO allies, or a failure for Canada and its NATO allies?






## **A Country Deeply Divided:**


## **A Country Deeply Pessimistic:**
