




### Methodology

- These are some of the findings of an Ipsos Reid poll conducted on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2014, from 9am until 4pm on behalf CTV News and CP24.
- The pre-debate survey was conducted among 2,068 Ontarian adults. Respondents were selected via the Ipsos I-Say Online Panel, Ipsos Reid's national online panel. The sample was drawn from a pre-recruited panel of 4,152 Ontarians who say they will vote on Election Day and indicated that they would watch the leaders' debate.
- Weighting was then employed to balance demographics to ensure that the sample's composition reflects that of the adult population according to Census data and to provide results intended to approximate the sample universe.
- The precision of Ipsos online surveys is measured using a Bayesian Credibility Interval. In this case, the pre-debate poll can be considered accurate to within +/-2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would have been had the entire population of voters who will watch the debate been polled. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error, and measurement error.




### PRE: Who do you think will win tonight's leaders' debate?



PRE1. Who do you think will WIN tonight's leaders' debate? Base: All Respondents: Pre n= 2,068




#### PRE: Which party leader do you think offers the best ideas and policies?



PRE2. Which party leader do you think offers the Best Ideas and Policies? Base: All Respondents: Pre n= 2,068




#### PRE: Which party leader do you think sounds and acts most like a Premier?



PRE3. Which party leader do you think Sounds and Acts most like a Premier? Base: All Respondents: Pre n= 2,068





# Which party leader do you think is the most visually attractive?



### Time for change vs. Deserves re-election?



## What is the most important issue for you in this election, the one that you most want the political leaders and candidates to be talking about?



















